BLUEBIRD POLICY INFORMATION

The current Bluebird policy manual is on line at www.pwcgov.org/bluebird. It is your responsibility to make yourself aware of important information concerning your Bluebird experience.

Payment Policy

Payments for trips are due within two weeks of making the reservation. Check, exact cash, money order or credit card is accepted. If you do not make your payment within those two weeks your name can be dropped from the reservation list without notice. Receipts for payments can be emailed. When making your payment, request a receipt by providing an active email address. If you don't have email, request a confirmation be mailed. Deposits: Quality Tours requires deposits for certain trips at time of booking and is noted in that trips description. The deposits would be refundable if the trip does not run. However, once a participant signs up there are typically no refunds given unless it falls under the criteria in Refunds and Cancellations.

Refunds and Cancellations

If you need to cancel your reservation, please call Quality Tour Transportation and speak with one of the agents handling the Bluebird Tour program. All cancellations are subject to an administrative fee of \$5.00 for day trips and \$10.00 for overnight trips. A refund will only be given if there is someone on the "standby list" to take your space Trip cancellation insurance is available only for the overnight tours and it is highly suggested.

Guidelines for Tipping

The suggested gratuity for a driver is \$2-\$3 per day. The gratuity for sightseeing guides is included in cost of tour. A docent is usually not tipped for their service. If a meal is included in a tour, all taxes and gratuities have already been included in the tour cost (excluding alcoholic beverages). Tour Escorts do not expect tips but do appreciate them.

Trip Insurance

TRIP CANCELLATION INSURANCE IS AVAILABLE ONLY ON OVERNIGHT TOURS AND IS NOT INCLUDED in the price of the overnight trips. However, insurance is available through Our Travel Guard Chartism and is available for everyone. Rates are based on the cost of the tour and your age. The insurance provides trip cancellation coverage, trip interruption coverage, baggage up to \$500, emergency accident/sickness medical expenses up to \$2,500, and emergency evacuation repatriation of remains up to \$25,000. The insurance must be paid for with your first deposit or payment on the trip. The cost will be provided on request.

Seating Policy for One Day Trips

Passengers boarding in Manassas sit on the Driver's side of the bus. Passengers boarding in Woodbridge sit on the Door side of the bus.

Departure Points

Plan to arrive at least **I5 minute**s before trip departure time.

One Day Tours

Manassas Walmart at the WaWa located at 9401 Liberia Avenue. We load in the parking lot on your right close to Wawa. No parking overnight.

Woodbridge at Featherstone Shopping Center located at 14527 Jefferson Davis Highway. We load in the rear of McDonald's. No parking overnight.

Overnight Tours

Manassas at the public parking lot next door to the Manassas Sr. Center located at 9320 Mosby Street, Manassas, VA 20110.

Woodbridge at the A. J. Ferlazzo Building located at 15941 Donald Curtis Drive, Woodbridge, VA 22191. For this pickup point you will receive a parking permit in with your baggage tags and itinerary

Return Times

The bus driver and/or escort will make the decision as to which location will be dropped off first. The decision will be based on the factors that affect driving. **Note:** All return times are approximate. The driver will provide a more exact time on the return day of the trip.

<u>Alcohol</u>

No consumption of alcohol is permitted on the bus. All tours take place on a Quality Tour Transport motor coach.

RESERVATIONS

Reservations commence on the date listed under each tour destination in this schedule. On that date, reservations are accepted by telephone only at (703) 339-0333 beginning at 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. Monday-Friday. On reservation day, reservations can be made for up to four persons per phone call. One-day tours must have a minimum of twenty persons to run and an overnight tour must have a minimum of thirty persons to run.

At the time of reservation any special accommodations, including but not limited to seating and dietary restrictions, should be mentioned.

Three (3) days after the initial reservation date, remaining space will be opened to residents over 18 years of age as well as groups from Prince William County and neighboring counties. Installment payments may be arranged for any tour with the reservationist at time of booking.

Next, we are off to Mardi Gras World where our admission is included. Peek behind the curtains and see one of the most colorful and vivacious festivals in the making. The lights, the kaleidoscope of colors, the festive music and joie de vivre are all here in one magical place. Their floats have been in parades in the United States and abroad. Afterwards, we will have free time in Jackson Square for lunch on your own. Historic Jackson Square, originally known in the 18th century as "Place d'Armes" and later renamed in honor of the Battle of New Orleans hero,

Andrew Jackson, features many eclectic shops and galleries, open air cafes, as well as artists' paintings and displaying their work on the outside of the iron fence. Midafternoon we will board the motorcoach for a city sightseeing driving tour of New Orleans including the Saint Louis Cemetery which encompasses three Roman Catholic cemeteries in New Orleans. The oldest and most famous, Saint Louis Cemetery #1 was opened in 1789 replacing the city's older St. Peter as the main burial ground when the city was redesigned after a fire in 1788. All of the graves are above ground vaults; most were constructed in the late 18th century and 19th century. We will also ride out on the Plantation Road for a fascinating look into the lifestyles of the Cajun land owners at Laura Plantation. Dinner this evening will be included at the New Orleans School of Cooking where since 1980 they have introduced countless visitors from around the world to the wonderful food and rich culture of New Orleans and Louisiana as a whole. The school is located in a renovated molasses warehouse built in the early 1800's in the heart of the French Quarter. We will return to the hotel after dinner where we can enjoy the hotel amenities or once again enjoy the festivities on Bourbon Street.

DAY 5: MONDAY JULY 20

Breakfast will be included at the hotel. This morning we will visit **World War II Museum** within walking distance of our hotel. There are three buildings making up this museum plus included is your admission to two movies that will make this a memorable visit. Returning to the hotel whenever you wish, you have an entire afternoon free to shop or visit one of the local art galleries or spend time in Jackson Square. This evening we will enjoy a leisurely **jazz dinner cruise** aboard the *Natchez Queen* paddle wheeler on the Mississippi River.

This evening will be an evening of enchantment filled with music, a tour of fabulous home and a candlelight dinner at Magnolia Hall. Construction on Magnolia Hall is believed to have begun in 1858, as the residence of Thomas Henderson who was a Natchez native that became a wealthy cotton broker and merchant. The name of the house was inspired by the plaster magnolia blossoms incorporated into the design of the parlor ceiling centerpieces. We will return to the hotel after dinner.

DAY 7: WEDNESDAY, JULY 22

Wake to breakfast included at the hotel before we board our motorcoach for a **driving tour** of **Natchez**. Founded in 1716, the first route into Natchez was the Natchez Trace, originally a buffalo trail and later used by Native Americans and settlers. Natchez fell under British and Spanish rule respectively by 1798. Tobacco and indigo were initial crops, but the introduction of the Whitney gin in 1795, combined with the already established institution of slavery,

revolutionized cotton production and brought great wealth to Natchez planters and merchants. Much of that wealth produced grand city and country estates, some of them owned and occupied by the same families for over 150 vears. We will then head over to Frogmore Cotton Plantation and learn the history of cotton growing and picking from past to present. Frogmore is an 1800-acre working cotton plantation with 18 restored antebellum structures that date back to the early 1800's. There is cotton in the fields to pick from mid-July through April; then planting begins anew. Learn about the causes and effects of change on a working cotton plantation from the 1700's through today. We will then proceed to the newly restored and reopened Choctaw Hall where we will enjoy a private tour and lunch. Constructed in 1836 for Joseph Neibert, Choctaw is a traditional Natchez mansion containing the general Federal style while blending Greek Revival details. Our last plantation is Canemount. Listed on the National Register of Historic places as Canemount Plantation Inn is a 40-acre property that includes an 1855 Italinate home, The 1829 carriage house and additional buildings. Come enjoy the tranquility of days gone by. We will then enjoy some of the best fried chicken you ever tasted served at the Old Country Store buffet style.

DAY 8: THRSDAY, JULY 23
