Location: Northern Virginia 4-H Educational Center (for Northern District Participants)



The 4-H Congress Leadership Team is working to put together a great,

high quality educational leadership program for our participants that will provide the same level of learning and fun that is typically experienced with Congress in Blacksburg. We anticipate utilizing updated technologies at the 4-H centers to provide synchronous virtual programming for statewide assemblies and workshops, as well as giving districts ample time to provide their own in-person programs on site. Competitions will occur virtually outside of Congress, as was the case last year, and winners will be announced at the conclusion of Congress along with the annual Share the Fun Show. Also like last year, the Virginia 4-H All Stars will have time to conduct a virtual welcome ceremony – although we will not be able to conduct in-person tapping ceremonies at each location due to our safety guidelines. Housing, meals, social activities, etc. will follow the same health and safety guidelines at each center as we are using for 4-H

camps. Registration information is expected soon!

Move it Monday Ran in Support of Run for the Fallen

Lending their HEARTS to a good cause and practicing their running skills! On Sunday, May 2nd, a group of 4-H youth and adult volunteers used their head, hearts, hands, and health to run alongside the runners in Virginia Run for the Fallen for the first mile of their journey as a community service initiative to pay tribute to every Virginia military service member who has died while serving, or as a result of serving, during the War on Terror. Many 4-H'ers chose to run for an additional 30 minutes in honor of Mark Stubenhoffer of Springfield, Virginia, assigned to the 1st Battalion, 41st Infantry Regiment, 1st Armored Division, Fort Riley, Kansas, who died while serving During Operation Iraqi Freedom on December 7, 2004, at the age of 30. Virginia Run for the Fallen is a statewide relay foot run that covers 250 miles through fourteen counties remembering over 700 fallen.



Prince William-Fairfax County Farm Bureau Scholarship

The Prince William-Fairfax County Farm Bureau, established in 1966 is a free, independent, non-governmental voluntary organization of persons, firms and corporations interested in agriculture united for the purpose of analyzing their problems and formulating actions to achieve educational improvements, economic opportunity, and social advancement. The Bureau is offering two \$1500 scholarships to high school



Bernard Malo Scholarship

Bernard Malo was a past leader of the Trigger Time 4-H Shooting Education Club. Bernie, a 4-H All Star, was active at the local, district, and state level and gave much to the youth of Virginia. His family, who are all 4-H'ers and friends, started a scholarship fund to honor his memory. Trigger Time 4-H Club members have continued to help this scholarship fund grow. This scholarship is for higher education for those entering as a freshman into any four year college, community college or vocational school. Amount of scholarship may vary from year to year. Two letters of reference are required to be submitted with the application, and more are acceptable. The scholarship review committee may consist of Trigger Time 4-H adult volunteers, other 4-H adult volunteers and/or 4-H staff. Those applying from Trigger Time Shooting Sports 4-H Club will be given first consideration for this scholarship. The review panel for this scholarship will meet and decide before the end of the high school year. **Applications must be received by May 21st.** <u>Click here to apply.</u>

Joanne Guhl Scholarship

Joanne Guhl was a member of the Boots and Saddles 4-H Club who died in a tragic automobile accident in 1984. Her parents honor her memory by awarding a college scholarship to a 4Her. Applicants must be enrolled the Prince William County 4-H program and must have been accepted at an institution of higher learning. Preference is given to 4-Hers pursuing a career in animal science. 
Statewide 4-H COVID Guidelines Reminder

As clubs begin to meet more regularly and in person, please review our statewide COVID guidelines for 4 -H in person programming. <u>Please click here for the complete guidelines</u>. Some key points:

- Discourage attendance by anyone sick or showing signs of illness within the last 14 days
- Adhere to CDC Guidelines for Cleaning and Disinfecting
- Identify Frequently Touched Areas and Disinfect Regularly or between users
- Physical Distancing Implemented 6 ft distance whenever possible \circ Includes tables, bleachers, seating areas \circ Avoid small rooms or tight quarters \circ Program may need to be modified in order to achieve social distancing requirements.
- No sharing of equipment or supplies
- All in-person 4-H program participants, youth and adult, are required to wear an appropriate face covering/mask. Face coverings/masks are required for both indoor and outdoor programs and during transportation (unless the transport vehicle occupants are from the same family).
- The only exceptions to the face covering/mask requirement are as follows:
- When handling an animal in certain areas where adequate physical distancing can be maintained and properly ensured, such as while on a horse, in a show ring, in a line-up area waiting to enter the show ring, or in a designated grooming area or wash rack.
- When standing on the firing line during shooting education programs; however, six feet of physical distance is required.
- When a medical condition prevents the participant from wearing a face covering/mask. If you are a person with a disability and desire any assistive devices, services, or other accommodations to participate in this activity, please contact your local extension office to discuss accommodations at least 5 days prior to the event.

Compliance with 4-H COVID guidelines promotes the health, safety, and well-being of all program participants. 4-H programs/ events that are found to be in non-compliance may be immediately suspended, if compliance with 4-H guidelines is not demonstrated.
