

## THE DESCENDANTS OF SAMUEL AND NELLIE NAYLOR an African American Family of Prince William County

Samuel Naylor was born a slave about 1798,<sup>1</sup> in Prince William County,<sup>2</sup> Virginia. He was able to purchase his freedom from his master<sup>3</sup> and also saved \$500, enough money to purchase over 50 acres of land in present day Manassas Park, Virginia. The land purchased in November of 1865 was part of the "Liberia" tract owned by William J Weir.<sup>4</sup>



Nellie Naylor the wife of Samuel was born about 1799<sup>5</sup> and was a servant of the Weir family:<sup>6</sup> most of her children were born on the Liberia farm. Nellie was a faithful servant to the Weirs and had the singular honor of being given 12 1/2 acres of land from the Weir family “for the love and affection they have for their faithful servant”.<sup>7</sup> This honor was given to Nellie immediately after the Civil war during which the Liberia house was left under the protection of servants.<sup>8</sup> It is quite possible that the Naylor were responsible for the protection of the Liberia house.

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
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Samuel and Nellie raised seven children: 1) Henry, 2) Cornelius, 3) Jane, 4) Sarah, 5) Philip, 6) Maria and 7) Samuel.<sup>9</sup> Samuel farmed his own land until he died of rheumatism on Christmas eve in 1872.<sup>10</sup> After his death Samuel’s farm was divided among his children with each receiving nine acres.<sup>11</sup> Nellie continued living in her house with her family nearby until her death on February 27, 1896.<sup>12</sup> According to her death record she was 103 years old, but its more likely that she was a few years shy of a century.<sup>13</sup> In her will Nellie bequeathed her possessions to her children and grandchildren, among which was a silver tea pot (see the will of Nellie Naylor, attached).


1) Henry Naylor was born about 1818, probably in Fairfax County, Virginia. He married Animia Jackson,<sup>14</sup> or Ninnia as she was sometimes called, also a slave of the Weir family.<sup>15</sup> Henry and Ninnia raised thirteen children: Page, Lewis, Jennie, Jarret, Ann, Nellie, Roseannah, Rebecca, Henry, Ida,<sup>16</sup> William, Millie and Dora.<sup>17</sup> Three of their children, Lewis,<sup>18</sup> Ann<sup>19</sup> and Rebecca<sup>20</sup> died at a young age. After being set free by the Civil War, Henry worked as a farm laborer and upon his father’s death inherited his own farm, lot number 3. Like many families of the time, Henry had trouble raising enough money to pay taxes. In 1874 he filed a homestead claim to protect his land from being seized.<sup>21</sup> Henry

died before May of 1882.<sup>22</sup> His land was subsequently sold to Charles L. Hynson for \$65.<sup>23</sup> Henry's son Jerod Naylor continued to live near Manassas where he raised a large family. For nearly fifty years he worked for the Portner family,<sup>24</sup> a wealthy family that had purchased the "Liberia" farm (see Jerod Naylor obituary on page 77).

2) Cornelius or "Neil" Naylor, the second son of Samuel and Nellie, was an accomplished miller for the Weir family. He was the miller for the Milford Mill in Prince William County and was in attendance there when the Union army came through and removed some belongings of the Willcoxon family. Neil "remained at the mill until after the Union army came to Manassas."<sup>25</sup> Cornelius' job as a miller ended when the Milford Mill was sold in 1866.<sup>26</sup> On Dec. 31, 1867 Cornelius, a widower, married Anna Robertson,<sup>27</sup> he had three children from his previous marriage, Adeline,<sup>28</sup> Mary and Martha.<sup>29</sup> Adeline would later marry a school teacher<sup>30</sup> by the name of Charles Jarman<sup>31</sup> [or German]. Their son Charles German Jr. would later be instrumental in putting out the great Manassas fire of 1905<sup>32</sup> (see page 77 for article, "Manassas Swept by Fire"). In 1870 Neil was living in Centreville, Virginia<sup>33</sup> where he worked as a farm laborer and mechanic. Upon his father's death on Christmas eve 1872, Neil inherited lot 6 of the family farm. It is not known exactly when Cornelius died but in her will dated 1881, his mother requested that "he shall during his lifetime have a home in the house now occupied by me, and that he shall occupy the room adjoining the kitchen."<sup>34</sup> The 1880 census for Concordia County, Louisiana pg. 124, has Nahl Nailor a black male age 60 born in Virginia; perhaps Neil Naylor moved to a warmer climate.



3) Jane Naylor was probably born about 1825. She married Beverly Robinson<sup>35</sup> and gave birth to seven known children.<sup>36</sup> The oldest was Arthur Robinson born about 1845<sup>37</sup> followed by Beverly R. born about 1847,<sup>38</sup> Almer, Harriet born about 1853, Eliza or "Lizzie" born Apr. 1, 1854,<sup>39</sup> Nellie born Aug. 31, 1856,<sup>40</sup> and Nathaniel born Sep. 25, 1858.<sup>41</sup> No record has been found of Jane's death but four of her children were being raised by their grandparents Samuel and Nellie in 1870.<sup>42</sup> Harriet Robinson age 16, is living in the household of Walter Weir along with Tasker Robinson age 65.<sup>43</sup> During the Civil War Jane's son Arthur was loaned out to the Confederate Army. From August 1<sup>st</sup> to 22 of 1862, Walter Weir (the son of William J Weir), hired out his "negro boy Authur as a teamster" for the Confederate Army. Walter was paid \$18.33 for Authur's services.<sup>44</sup> Arthur Robinson went on to become a well respected carpenter.<sup>45</sup> In 1903, the land that Jane's heirs inherited, lot 4, was sold to John Randolph to pay for back taxes.<sup>46</sup>

4) Sarah Naylor or "Sallie" as she was called, was born about 1836<sup>47</sup> on the Liberia farm. She gave birth to a son Charlie Naylor on Feb. 23, 1857,<sup>48</sup> at the time she was owned by Robert C Weir the son of William J Weir. She

married Landon Conway at some point and a second son John Randolph Conway<sup>49</sup> was born in 1859, he would later become a Baptist minister.<sup>50</sup> Late in 1862 William J. Weir moved to Fluvanna County, Virginia taking 22 of his slaves with him; Sallie was one of them. While there Sallie gave birth to a son, Landon named after his father.<sup>51</sup> Sallie's husband died sometime during the war and Sallie returned to Prince William County where she married John Randolph on February 1, 1866.<sup>52</sup> Sallie and John had six children: Emma Jane born on Dec. 9, 1866,<sup>53</sup> followed by Maria E, Nelly, Betty born June 16, 1876,<sup>54</sup> and twins William and Samuel.<sup>55</sup> John Randolph was an industrious man who gradually enlarged the land Sallie inherited, lot 5, until it reached 49 acres. Sallie inherited her mother's house in 1896 and in 1920, Sallie Randolph then age 83, was still to be found living in her home on Centreville Road.<sup>56</sup>

5) Philip Naylor was probably born in 1837. On Dec. 21, 1866, Philip Naylor age 29, married Amanda Smith from Fairfax, Virginia.<sup>57</sup> The couple lived on the family farm while Philip worked as a carpenter. John Naylor age 12 was living with the couple in 1870.<sup>58</sup> It is not known how John and Philip are related. On January 3, 1870 the following news item appeared in the paper: "Phillip Naylor, a colored man, residing in this vicinity, was about starting out last Thursday for a hunt, when his gun was discharged, severely wounding himself in the arm."<sup>59</sup> Desiring to work his own farm, Philip purchased 9 acres of land from his father for \$50. The land was situated on the edge of Centreville Road near Yorkshire.<sup>60</sup> On June 7, 1890 Philip's wife Amanda died due to "dropsy", she was 44.<sup>61</sup> The following year Philip married Grace.<sup>62</sup> It is not known if Philip had any children; he died intestate by March 16, 1903. His brother-in-law John Randolph administered the estate.<sup>63</sup>

6) Maria E. Naylor married Julius A. Clark and the two of them moved to Washington, DC.<sup>64</sup> Julius was a master house builder and Maria worked as a seamstress. In 1870 Maria and Julius shared their house with William Naylor, his wife Sarah and daughter Anna.<sup>65</sup> Also in the household was Adeline Naylor, Maria's niece and Cornelius' daughter. By 1880 Julius was working as a caterer instead of a builder;<sup>66</sup> he died shortly thereafter. By 1889 Maria was remarried to Cornelius Adams. In 1889 Marie sold 5 acres of the land she inherited from her father (lot no. 1) to her brother Philip.<sup>67</sup> In 1920 Maria age 71, was still living on Sheridan Road in Washington DC; her occupation is listed as a dressmaker.<sup>68</sup>

7) Not much is known about Samuel Naylor. He moved to Memphis, Tennessee some time before 1875 and died there on the 15<sup>th</sup> October 1878. He inherited lot number 2 from his father's estate which his widow Sarah sold to John Randolph in November of 1878.<sup>69</sup> Samuel died without issue.

**Jerod S Naylor**

Jerod S Naylor, colored, age 71, died at his home near Manassas on Tuesday, July 12 after a long illness. He was the son of Henry and Anemia Jackson Naylor and was born here in Manassas on January 10, 1867.

He had been a lifelong resident of the county and had been employed by the Portners and on their estate for nearly 50 years. He was well liked by the people of the town and will be greatly missed.

He is survived by his wife, Lucy Edmonia Naylor, and a number of children and grandchildren.

Funeral services were conducted in the First Baptist Church on July 15 at 2:00 pm and he was buried on the Old Randolph place in Fairfax County. This was one of the largest funerals held in this part of the country for some time.

**Manassas Swept by Fire - *Fairfax Herald*, Dec 8, 1905**

Fire broke out about 2 o'clock Tuesday morning, at Manassas, and destroyed one-half of the business section of the town. The loss was something like \$200,000. The fire originated from a defective flue in what is known as Blossom's Row, and spread rapidly to neighboring buildings. The business, houses and owners suffering losses are Mrs. R. J. Adamson, millinery; Turler-Lyles, barber; A. B. Davis, hardware merchant; W. I. Florence, shoemaker; Bell Bros., merchants and bankers; J. S. Bornum, restaurant; W. C. Wagener, furniture dealer; post office and office of Southern Railway; W. H. W. Moran, editor and owner of the *Manassas Journal*; Wade Goodwin, poolroom; James R. Dorrell, liveryman; W. L. Smith, merchant; Jack Johnson, shoemaker; Crigler & Camper, merchants; Walter Shannon, druggist; John Harper, barber; Mrs. Windsor, millinery; J. L. Moser, merchant; C. L. Hinson & Co., merchants; B. Abrahamson, merchant, and O. E. Newman, painter.

The real estate owners are E. E. Blossom, I. P. Baldwin, W. C. Wagener, George C. Round, Judge C. E. Nicol, Jack Johnson, R. W. Merchant, R. B. Sprinkle, O. E. Newman, Mrs. Elizabeth Wagner Brent.

Mr. W. H. W. Moran has purchased the printing plant recently owned by the Prince William Publishing Company and will get out this week's edition of his paper. The town hall is being used for the present post-office. Every available room has been rented, and some of the merchants who succeeded in saving a portion of their goods have already recommenced business.

It is largely due to the persistent efforts of the women of the town that other buildings were not burned. They worked shoulder to shoulder with the men in pumping and carrying water to the burning buildings, and one courageous woman was actually working in helping to pump the fire engine. The colored people also did timely work. Charles German, a young colored man, worked at the hose until he fell from sheer exhaustion.

Plans are already on foot to rebuild the burned portion of the town, and it is thought that the council will permit nothing but stone or brick buildings to be erected.

The people of Fairfax deplore the misfortune which has overtaken our neighboring town, but we feel assured that the indomitable spirit of the people of Manassas will not be broken by the catastrophe. Our friend, Mr. Moran of the *Journal*, in pushing right ahead with his business, has set an example which will have many followers, and which cannot be too heartily admired.

THE LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF NELLIE NAYLOR

In the name of God amen. I Nellie Naylor of Prince William County, do make this my last will & Testament as follows.

- 1<sup>st</sup>. To my son Henry I bequeath my short bedstead, sofa & my split bottom chair.
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> To my son Cornelius I bequeth my wardrobe and the shaving table which formerly belonged to his father, and it is my earnest desire that he shall during his lifetime have a home in the house now occupied by me, and that he shall occupy the room adjoining the kitchen.
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> I give and bequeath to my son Phillip my toilet table, the decanter (the flowered one) and the arm chair.
  - 4<sup>th</sup> I gave and bequeath to my daughter Maria, my clock and the silver tea pot.
  - 5<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my grandson Arthur Robinson my castors.
  - 6<sup>th</sup> I bequeath to my grandson Beverly Robinson his Uncle's portrait & also that of his uncle's wife.
  - 7<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my granddaughter Jane Randolph my brass andirons.
  - 8<sup>th</sup> I devise to my grandchildren, Lizzie, Nellie and Nathaniel Robinson three acres of land to be equally divided between them, said land adjoins Arthur Robinson and Sallie Randolph's tract, and is at present covered almost entirely with wood.
  - 9<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my daughter Sallie my bureau, looking glass, the dinning table & cover, the brass preserving kettle, & the high bedstead. And I devise to my said daughter Sallie in consideration of her taking care of me, my house and the land upon which it is situated, embracing three & three quarter acres (3 3/4) acres. reserving therefrom the family burying ground.
  - 10<sup>th</sup> I give & bequeath to my granddaughter Ida Naylor my featherbed.
- I hereby revoke all previous Wills and codicils hereto made by me. Witness my hand this 8<sup>th</sup> day of Nov. in the year of our lord 1881.

In Circuit Court Prince William County Sept 7<sup>th</sup> the last will and Testament of Nellie Naylor and codicil thereto was produced in court for probate, and the codicil hereto was fully proven by the oaths of F. E. Bandsell & Jno A. Nicol, subscribing witness and ordered to be certified.  
And at a County Court held for said County of Prince William December 6<sup>th</sup> 1897 The last will and testament of Nellie Naylor dec. was presented for probate and the signature thereto fully proven by the oath of Estelle D. Cross one of the witnesses, the other subscribing witness being unable to attend, and order to be recorded.

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## HOMESTEAD EXEMPTIONS IN PRINCE WILLIAM COUNTY, 1870-1887

by Donald L. Wilson, *Virginiana Librarian*

In 1870, the Virginia General Assembly approved an act permitting a householder or head of a family to set apart and hold a homestead and personal property, for the benefit of himself and his family, exempt from sale or debt. [Acts 1869-70, chapter 157, paragraph 198; amended chapter 276, paragraph 425.] This act replaced debt and bankruptcy protection laws passed in 1866 and 1867.

The supreme court of appeals of Virginia ruled afterwards that "The provision of the state constitution, and the act of the general assembly passed in pursuance thereof, known as the 'homestead exemption law,' so far as they apply to contracts entered into, or debts contracted before their adoption, are in violation of the constitution of the United States, and therefore void." [Code of Virginia, 1873, p. 98, note]

The law as enacted, protected the householder's real and personal property, up to \$2000, from seizure because of any debt "heretofore or hereafter acquired or contracted." The supreme court's ruling struck down the "heretofore" provision, but protected the homestead from new debts. The householder was to select which of his property should be protected by the homestead exemption, and the report to be recorded among the county's deeds.

The following persons are shown as filing homestead exemptions in Prince William County, as transcribed from the deeds index covering the period 1799-1887. The earliest recorded deed was for Newton Woodyard, dated 2 Aug. 1870. The latest in this list is Randolph Brady, dated 28 Oct. 1887. (Check later deeds indexes at the court house for additional filings.)

If a person appears on this list, they may also have filed in a federal court, under U.S. bankruptcy statutes passed in 1867. U.S. District Court records for the Eastern District of Virginia, including bankruptcy records 1868-1947 (Alexandria Division), are now housed at the National Archives Branch in Philadelphia. [Guide to Federal Records in the National Archives of the United States, paragraph 21.49.1]


## CROW AND FOX SCALP BOUNTY

*The following is a list of persons who were paid a bounty for crow and fox scalps June 2, 1856 in Prince William County. Each took an oath before a Justice of the Peace that the crows and foxes were killed within the past 12 months in Prince William County. In 1856 the bounty for crows was eight cents, gray adult foxes 50 cents, and red adult foxes 75 cents. [Transcribed from clerk's loose papers at the Prince William County Courthouse]*

## BRICK WALLS

When I began my genealogy journey in January 2001, I was initially interested only in "blood" kin. But early on, for reasons I cannot explain, I became engrossed in finding out more about my father's first wife, who died several years before my father married my mother. I grew up knowing my half-sister, Myrtle, by my father's first marriage. Myrtle was 25 years my senior and she had children a little older than me. I only knew that I was their aunt and we more or less grew up together. I will preface the rest of this by saying that I am one of those genealogy researchers who will always and forever regret that I did not give in to my passion for family knowledge many years earlier.

The family Bible that belonged to my father's Aunt Linda Cole had always been in our home; from time to time it became a fascination of mine to read the center pages with their information on family history. In the Bible, the recorded family information is done by many hands. These pages were what I started my research from -- at least the research on my father's family. I have since found that the information in the Bible has been, for the most part, accurate and invaluable. The only reference to my father's first wife was entered in a hand unknown to me and reads thus: "*Mrs. Nellie Estell Keys Departed This Life August 4, 1926, age 41 years, 11 months, 3 weeks & 5 days.*" Hence, what little research I had done on Nellie was hampered by the fact that I didn't have her maiden name. Myrtle's daughter, June, told me that her mother had always said that Nellie's maiden name was Cole -- so my research centered on finding a Nellie Estell(e) Cole. The only one I found for that area of Virginia was much older than "my" Nellie would have been. Of course, knowing her age at death allowed me to know her year of birth. The search was on! But the only information I found on her was from the 1910 and 1920 Federal Census for Prince William County, Virginia, in which she was listed with my father and Myrtle, and living with Aunt Linda at the Independent Hill farm.

I was at this impasse in August of 2001 when I was able to pay my first visit to RELIC. One of my many priorities on this visit was to see if I could find any more information on Nellie. I was able to spend just the one day at RELIC and there I met Beverly Veness. She was a tremendous help with the various searches I was working on and I found most of the information on my "want" list, with the exception of anything on Nellie. I finally left RELIC to catch a bit of dinner, returning in time for a planned meeting with a newfound cousin, Carolyn Lynn. I had given up on my search for Nellie, assuming it was a lost cause for now. The evening was getting on and I still had to drive back to Maryland. I knew that I would not be able to get back to RELIC until the summer of 2002.

Then, literally just ten minutes before I left RELIC, Beverly came up to Carolyn and I as we were chatting. She seemed excited and said, "I think I've found her, I think I've found her!" Now, those of you reading this know the thrill of this kind of find! And yes... Beverly had indeed found "my" Nellie! It turns out I had been laboring under a bit of misinformation and that proved to be the biggest stumbling block. Sure enough, there she was. Beverly had found her in the *Bureau of Vital Statistics Virginia Death Certificates for 1912-1939 [microfilm]*. Her true name was Nellie Elizabeth, not Estelle, although the reason for that was deduced later, and she was listed under KEY, not KEYS. That also was explained later. The other information was correct and it was indeed Nellie, my father's first wife.

Upon returning home to Arizona a few days later, I sent to Virginia for a copy of Nellie's death certificate. The reason she was listed under the surname "KEY" was explained when looking at her death certificate; the "s" was so faint as to be almost indiscernible and so was left out when someone recorded her death in the record. I also learned that Nellie was born the daughter of Benjamin F. and Mary (Horton) Gallahan. I had thought her father's name was Berryman due to some erroneous information I subsequently found on the internet. I have since found through census information that his name was Benjamin Franklin Gallahan. This has given me a new direction for research, and although I have not had much luck with the Gallahans, and even less with the Hortons, they have definitely been added to my list of "wants." I have since also assumed that Nellie was listed in the family Bible with the middle name of Estell because whoever put the information in only knew her middle initial was E, and assumed it was Estell because my father and Nellie had named their daughter Myrtle Estelle.

I had the passion and, fortunately for me, Beverly had the perseverance! Thank you again, Beverly! And happy hunting to all!

## POLL TAX LISTS FOR PRINCE WILLIAM COUNTY, VIRGINIA DUMFRIES DISTRICT AND QUANTICO TOWN (1940s)

*Transcribed by Beverly R. Veness*

Copies of the 1940's poll tax lists for Prince William County are kept in the manuscript holdings at RELIC. A photocopy of the lists has been made and bound. The bound copy (VA 975.5273 Pri) is currently on the "New Books" shelf in RELIC. The listings give the person's name with a record of which years of the previous three that taxes were paid; thus the list in 1944 includes the fees paid for 1941-1944. The lists for the years 1944-1949 have been combined and provide a "census" of those who had paid their poll tax 1941-1949.

Reported districts in the Poll Tax Lists for Prince William County are Brentsville (*Prince William Reliquary, vol. 1, No. 2*), Coles (*Prince William Reliquary, vol. 1, No. 3*), Dumfries including Quantico Town (*this issue*), Gainesville, Manassas District & Town and Occoquan District & Town. The remaining districts will be transcribed in upcoming issues of *Prince William Reliquary*.

Up until 1946, the poll tax list for Dumfries District included the town of Quantico. After 1947, the town of Quantico was reported separately. If the person resided in Quantico, a bold "Q" is indicated with what years they were registered in the town. The splitting of the district must have been confusing because some names were registered in both the Dumfries District as well as town of Quantico. You may see a person's name registered in both. Also some names appear in both the White's list and Colored's list. Names and districts have been recorded as they appeared. If you see two middle initials indicated by an "or", it means one year one initial was given and on another year a different initial. It is unknown which one is a typo so I have left both in. All variant spellings of names have been recorded. The Dumfries District and town of Quantico poll tax lists follow.

## LOOKING BACK – PRINCE WILLIAM NEWS

Funding of public highways in Northern Virginia was a topic of great public interest seventy years ago, just as it is today.

WILL ATTEND ROAD MEETING.

Representative Citizens to Be at Hearing of State Commission.

The meeting at which apportionment of road funds available under the state gas tax will take place Monday forenoon at Culpeper, the headquarters of the road district. Commonwealth's Attorney Lion, Chairman Lindey Dawson and other members of the Board of Supervisors, Dr. E. H. Marsteller, Town Manager Cocke, and a number of others will be on hand. The sentiment is somewhat divided among Prince William citizens, some arguing that any fund at all will be acceptable which will bring improvement to some of the present roadways by virtue of encouraging travel over the roadways so treated. Others feel that the State commission should be left to work out the salvation of the county in its own good way, by surveys and the ultimate permanent improvement of roads so considered. The fact is that Prince William has received little money as compared with many other Virginia counties. Resentment of this fact will not mend things specially. Mr. Shirley has tried in the main to treat things comprehensively, but the Commission will heed a combined and concerted effort along any one line which a county may pursue. These assignments are purely tentative, but they represent considerable study, and the Commission will not upset or change them unless the arguments are sound.

## BUCKLAND: THE MAN AND THE STAIRS

*A Ghost Story by Mark Joyner and Karen Walton*



I moved in on Halloween night, October 31, 1999. The house is wonderful! It is a two-story home with three chimneys. The lower portion of the home is a log cabin with a large stone chimney built around the 1790's by Richard Gill who first bought the property and had one year to erect a permanent home. The house sits in a small village known as Buckland Mills in Prince William County. The town was founded in 1798 but its history goes back further than that. As far as is known, it began with the Manahanockin Indians (1100 to 1500 c.e.). Revolutionary soldiers worked and lived in the area of Buckland and Civil War battles have been fought there. (The Battle of Buckland Races was fought on October 19, 1863.) There are also plantations of great fame, taverns and blacksmith

shops, mills and school houses, cemeteries and springhouses. The whole town is not only rich in history, but there is a spectacular archaeological record of the objects that have been left behind in Buckland.

When I signed the house agreement, by law the realtor had to tell me if the place had been rumored, documented or by first hand experience been said to be haunted. On moving night, we completed the unloading of the moving van and sat around and had a glass of water. Among the young men that helped me was a 17 year old boy who thought he was the "baddest" thing on the earth. When it was his turn to take boxes and furniture into the house, he said there was no way he was going inside. He would only go as far as the front porch because I had shared with the guys who helped me move the story that the realtor told me.

According to the realtor, there were noises – the bumps, creaks and settling of the old house -- but that was only the rational explanation. The real truth of it is that the house has been noted as being haunted. Apparently one of the previous owners had come home one night quite inebriated, made it as far as the front yard and passed out. Some of the neighbors found the man lying there, picked him up and carried him into the house. They took him upstairs and laid him in bed. When they came back later to check on him, they found he had passed away sometime during the night. It is also said that the top story of the house is where a Confederate sharp shooter was standing picking off the Yankees as they crossed the bridge.

I asked my best friend, who had helped me move, if he would spend the night in the house with me since it was Halloween and he still had a three hour drive back home. He said, "You have to be out of your mind! There is no way I am going to spend Halloween night in a haunted house!" So I had to spend the night alone with only my sleeping bag, a bunch of boxes and stacked furniture. I started unpacking all the glass framed pictures and leaned them up along the wall in the dining room by the stairs. I had to stay up until midnight just to see what would, if anything, happen in this house. I didn't have to wait long! Right around 10:30 pm I heard a terrific shattering of glass come from the dining room. It sounded like one of the frames had fallen over and smashed the glass. I got up and poked my head into the room to take a quick peek. To my surprise, there was nothing out of place -- nothing broken, no shattered glass. I yelled out, "Just tell me which picture you don't want me to hang and I won't!" With that, I



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sat back down in the living room. Around midnight I was  
expecting something weird to happen, but midnight came  
and went without further incident.

I figured, "This is cool. The realtor must have been  
mistaken." If nothing happened at midnight on All Hallow's  
Eve then the stories had to be just that – stories. Little did I  
know what the house had in store for a friend's guest and  
me.

My second experience happened a few nights later  
while I was lying in bed. It was around 10:28 pm and an  
eerie sense came over me as I fell fast asleep. It couldn't  
have been more than a few minutes later when I heard the  
footsteps of someone coming up the stairs. I laid in bed,  
gripped with fear, but I knew I had to do something, so I  
jumped up and ran to the top of the stairs. I was expecting to  
see someone on the stairs but there was no sign of anybody  
or anything. Still quite shaken, I laid back down in bed to  
try and get some sleep. The next morning I woke and tried  
to tell myself it was all just imagination, but I didn't really  
believe it.

I have been in the house for three years now and I  
never go to bed before 10:30 pm, because the "mystery  
man" walks the stairs every night at exactly that time. I have  
had some of my friends come over to witness the sounds.  
Some have even ventured to sit on the stairs at 10:30 and,  
sure enough, the stairs bump, thump and creak regardless.  
Perhaps this is the man who had passed out and was carried  
up to his bed and now every night he tries to make it to his  
bed by walking up the stairs on his own. Of course, many  
spirits are rumored to inhabit the Buckland Mills area, so it  
could be someone else.

Here is another accounting from one of the many  
that have spent considerable time in the house. This story  
comes from a very close and trusted friend as she related it  
to me.

"One evening, this past winter in the beginning of  
the year 2002, I witnessed an image of which today I still  
cannot fully explain. It was between the hours of 10:00 pm  
and 11:00 pm, if I remember correctly, and I was watching a  
movie. I was seated on the sofa in the living room of this  
most quaint and simple historic Buckland home, a quiet  
evening watching television. There are always stories and  
rumors in small towns of things that have happened, sounds  
that have been heard and visions that have been seen. Some  
are widely known and some are not. Having recently  
learned a great deal of the history of the relatively small but  
richly historic Buckland Mills area, I knew that what I  
witnessed - and to this very moment will still swear to  
having witnessed - was not entirely out of place. It was a  
vision, an image perhaps, of a soldier standing in a doorway.

"He was there for but a moment - a second, maybe  
two, but no longer. In the blink of an eye he was there and  
then he was gone. Somehow I can still see him exactly as he  
was in my mind's eye. He was wearing a gray uniform, on

his head a gray flat-topped soldier's hat. He was blond and blue-eyed and looked fairly young; I'd say 18 to 22 years old. He was not looking at me but beyond me, as one does when in deep thought. I was not afraid when I saw him. I was rather startled; my heart did seem to skip a beat. My blood pressure rose as I could faintly detect the pulsing in my ears. Somehow deep inside I knew that what I had seen was no random vision of the imagination. In the way it appeared real, it was equally unreal. I did tell of that which I saw, and was very careful as to how I went about it, so as not to offend or be embarrassed by my admission.

"There have been numerous other times when I have experienced the unusual sounds that have been heard in this particular house in Buckland, such as the creaking and popping sounds of the stairs that rise from the dining room to one of the upstairs bedrooms, usually occurring between 10:00pm and 11:00pm. I've heard this happen many times now, yet every time it happens I am again amazed. Each time I hear it I wonder, 'What does that and why?'"

To this day I, myself, have heard many a strange sound and witnessed some bizarre sights. The curtains in the lower part of the house open on their own in the middle of the afternoon. I would come home from work to find all of them drawn open. I would close them and go off to work the next morning only to return in the afternoon and find them open again. At first I thought someone was entering the house and opening them. I had to start pinning them closed for a while just so they wouldn't be torn from the rods. A month had passed, so I started removing the pins that held them shut. I have had no further problems with the curtains since. I have heard horse and carriages pass by the house going down what was Elizabeth Street during the colonial period. It is always in the middle of the night. We have photographed the specter at the base of the stairs as it appears. It comes in a wisp of bluish gray light, like a thin smoke swirling up and around the stairs. Others have heard voices emanating from the dining room area. Some of the voices are adults and some are those of small children.


Even with all these happenings, it is spectacular to live in a village of such fine old Colonial and Antebellum homes, a place so thick with a history that is just now being understood.

## LOST AND FOUND



### Missing Pages dated January and February 1779 from Prince William Order Book

Listed by the Seller as a miscellaneous page from the Court of Prince William County, he described the document as follows: "The obverse discusses the case of Luke Lindsey, an indentured servant of John McMillion, who was committed to the "goal" for feloniously breaking and entering the house of Charles Stewart with a drawn weapon made of iron and upwards of two feet long which he held in his hand and robbed Charles Stewart. Signed by William Carr. The reverse discusses Deeds of Lease to numerous parties. Name mentioned include James Nisbett, John Mcmillian, John Murray, Sarah Sewell, Bret Johnston, Thomas Lawson, John Reno, John Masrae [Macrae], Francis Jackson, Joshua Carney, Mathew Harrison, John Chancellor, Robert Graham, Thomas Young, and James Nisbett amongst others." The missing page was purchased at auction by the Library of Virginia Archives.
