Youth 4-H Officers Jump Into the New 4-H Year!



On Monday, November 15th, Prince William 4-H held its annual **4-H Youth Officer Training** at the McCoart Building in Woodbridge. We had a terrific turnout with over 40 current youth officers, newly elected youth officers, and others interested in becoming an officer and learning about the roles of officers in 4-H clubs, Northern District 4-H, and Virginia 4-H programs. We also had 10 dedicated leaders and volunteers join us to lead activities and facilitate lively discussion between youth participants.

Through activities, games, role playing and discussions, 4-H'ers explored the responsibilities of various leadership roles and parliamentary procedure. We began by sharing our goals for the evening, which varied from learning the responsibilities of specific officer roles, becoming more organized, learning how to run a meeting, and gaining confidence in public speaking. Those in attendance shared their thoughts on Parliamentary Procedure and reasons why it is important to use these procedures in our club meetings to ensure fairness, order, majority decisions, and making club meetings predictable.

Prince William 4-H staff will be following up with youth to answer questions and assist with resources and tools to help them be successful in their leadership roles.

Information for Club Reporters and Historians

Prince William 4-H wants to hear from you! We're proud of our clubs and want to showcase your activities and events in our newsletter. We're asking Club Reporters or Historians to send us regular updates. The updates could be a paragraph and picture showcasing a fun activity or project that you work on. It could be a request for donations, help, or support for an upcoming project or community service activity. Or, the update could be to recognize a club

member or members that have received community recognition and earned a "shout out." Regular communications will encourage others to get involved in 4-H and will help improve your writing and leadership skills! Here are some tips:

When submitting information to Prince William 4-H:

- Be specific. Include details such as date, location, who, what, and why. Include interesting facts that tell the 4-H story.
- Be concise. Capture the readers attention quickly and summarize your activity.
- Include quotes from club members or those you helped.
- Use paragraphs, correct grammar and punctuation. No other formatting is necessary.
- Include a clear, high resolution photo(s). Group photos and photos of 4-H'ers involved in activities are preferred. Be sure participants are following the [current mask protocol](#).
- Email your paragraph, press release, or article and photo to Candi Helmlinger at chelmlinger@pwcgov.org.

When submitting information to the community:

Along with the items bulleted above, information going out to the community should correctly use the 4-H trademark and logo and contain the current Virginia Cooperative Extension/4-H indicia statement.

- The **4-H Graphic Standards & Guidelines** ensures proper use of the 4-H logo and brand. In general, 4-H is a federal trademark and should always include the hyphen. The clover logo has restricted use and the guideline should be reviewed before including the logo in your community news. [Click here for the 4-H Graphic Standards & Guidelines](#).
- The VCE Indicia statement must be included at the bottom of every flyer or press release that is sent to the community. The current statement is:

Virginia Cooperative Extension is a partnership of Virginia Tech, Virginia State University, the U.S. Department of Agriculture, and local governments. Its programs and employment are open to all, regardless of age, color, disability, gender, gender identity, gender expression, national origin, political affiliation, race, religion, sexual orientation, genetic information, military status, or any other basis protected by law.

Moberly AJROTC defeats Trigger Time 4-H Shooting Education Club

November 14, 2021- Shooting their highest score of the season Moberly AJROTC defeated Trigger Time 4-H Shooting Education Club 1048.2 to 1024.4 last week in the National Air Rifle League. With the win, Moberly AJROTC is in fifth place overall and first place within their 'Army Jrotc' conference. They currently have a 6 - 0 record. Moberly AJROTC was led by, Anastaza Buckner who shot a 270.7. The remaining contributing members were Austin Taylor, MacKenzie Hopper, and Jenna Walz. Moberly AJROTC is from Moberly, MO, and is coached by Jeff Parks.

Trigger Time 4-H Shooting Education Club currently has a 4 - 3 record. After the loss they are in seventh place overall and second place within their 'Junior Rifle Club' conference. Trigger Time 4-H Shooting Education Club was led by, Samantha Erick who shot a 262.2. The remaining contributing members were Samantha Seagle, Lexi Strand, and Grace Richter. Trigger Time 4-H Shooting Education Club is from Nokesville, VA, and is coached by Alan Lerch.

Next up Moberly AJROTC will compete against Loveland AJROTC from Loveland, CO. Loveland AJROTC currently has a 5 - 1 record. While Trigger Time 4-H Shooting Education Club has a bye week.

These two teams are competing in the Distinguished Division of the Orion National Air Rifle League. Sponsored by the Orion Scoring System, the league is a national team league for high school teams and junior rifle clubs. The league has two parts. An 8 week regular season going on now, followed by a single game Conference Title Game for the top two teams in each conference.

In each game the teams compete in what is known as a Three-Position Air Rifle match. The match is modeled after Olympic Rifle competitions but adapted to high school age athletes. Each athlete will shoots 10 shots in three different shooting positions, prone, standing, and kneeling. Each shot is worth a maximum of 10.9 points. The sum of points scored in the 30 shots is the athlete's total. The team score is comprised of the best four athletes from each team.



- An overview of sUAS operation planning software, check sheets, smartphone apps, and other online resources;
- A comprehensive presentation and demonstration of image processing software techniques and options (image mosaics, NDVI, etc.)


