Exploring the Role of a 4-H Club Song Leader

The 4-H Club Song Leader is responsible for creating a feeling of friendship, teamwork and 4-H spirit at club meetings through the use of music . Here are some things to consider:

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- Work closely with your local leader and other club officers as you plan your song activities.
- Consider the time that will be available during the meeting for you to lead songs with your club.
- Come prepared with at least one song planned for each meeting, introducing a wide variety of songs. Be sure to practice in advance!
- Encourage all members to be involved in the songs. Consider making the songs interactive. Find hand movements, dance steps, sign language, and more, to encourage active participation.
- Stop by Prince William 4-H for song books and materials that are available at the office.
- Remember to speak loudly and clearly so that everyone can hear you. Consider passing out song sheets, or projecting the words on a monitor or screen.

Exploring the Role of a 4-H Club Historian



The 4-H Club Historian is the custodian of the club's history. They gather and record the present to preserve it for the future. The historian typically maintains a club scrapbook to document the growth and accomplishments achieved in 4-H club work. 4-H Club Historians should:

• Create a scrapbook or other record of all club activities and events for the year, keeping complete and accurate records and including details such as who, what, where, when and why.

• Collect photos and memorabilia from activities or ask other club members to contribute these. Memorabilia may also include documents, news clippings, meeting minutes, club rosters, club reports, thank you notes, certificates, awards and more.

• Label and date all scrapbook entries. Embellish photos and pages with stickers, colored paper, and other ornamentation to enhance the story.

- Submit your annual 4-H Club scrapbook to Prince William 4-H at the end of each 4-H year.
- Display your completed books at events such as Prince William 4-H Recognition Night or in a display at the 4-H Children's Barn at the PWC Fair.
