Updates

Fatal Crash Investigation *ADDITIONAL CHARGES – On November 16, investigators with the Crash Investigation Unit obtained additional charges for the driver involved in the fatal collision that occurred in the area of Centreville Rd. near Conner Dr. in Manassas (20111) on November 15. The investigation revealed that after striking the victim, the accused initially stopped and approached him as he laid injured in the roadway. When the victim attempted to use his phone, the accused took the phone and threw it, preventing him from calling for emergency services. After throwing the phone, the accused then fled the area, leaving the victim in the street. After consultation with Commonwealth Attorney's Office, investigators obtained additional arrest warrants for the accused, identified as Keiry Beatriz **ALVAREZ CONTRERAS**, who was arrested without incident.

Fatal Crash Investigation [Previously Released] – On November 15 at 7:16PM, investigators with the Crash Investigation Unit responded to the area of Centreville Rd. near Conner Dr. in Manassas (20111) to investigate a crash involving a pedestrian. The investigation revealed that the driver of a 2011 Hyundai Sonata was traveling southbound on Centreville Rd., when the vehicle struck a pedestrian who was walking in the roadway. The driver of the Sonata continued driving off the roadway and onto the median before fleeing the area. The pedestrian was transported to an area hospital where he died as a result of his injuries sustained in the crash. During the investigation, officers located the striking vehicle in the area of Burlington Ct. Officers also identified a woman who was driving at the time of the collision. Following the investigation, the driver, identified as Keiry Beatriz **ALVAREZ CONTRERAS**, was arrested. The investigation continues.

Armed Robbery – On November 17 at 1:19AM, officers responded to the 7-Eleven located at 7489 Limestone Dr. in Gainesville (20155) to investigate a robbery. An employee reported to police that an unknown masked man entered the store and immediately approached the employee who was located behind the service counter. During the encounter, the suspect brandished a firearm and demanded money from the cash registers. The suspect then forced the clerk into a room in the rear of the business before fleeing out the back door. No injuries were reported. A police K-9 searched the area for the suspect who was not located. An undisclosed amount of money was reported missing.

Arrests

Malicious Wounding – On November 14 at 9:50PM, officers responded to a residence located in the 8100 block of Oak St. in Manassas (20111) to investigate an assault. The investigation revealed that a 48-year-old male resident of the home and another resident of the home, identified as the accused, were involved in a verbal altercation that escalated when the accused struck the male resident. During the encounter, the victim, identified as a 40-year-old male acquaintance, intervened, and was struck by the accused. A physical altercation ensued between the victim and the accused, during which the accused bit the victim's finger. Eventually, the parties separated, and the accused fled prior to police arriving at the residence. The victim was transported to an area hospital with non-life threatening injuries and the male resident reported minor injuries. Following the investigation, on November 15, officers obtained arrest warrants for the accused, identified as Alexis Eliseo **GONZALEZ MOLINA**, who was arrested later that day by members of the Manassas Park Police Department.

Attempted Malicious Wounding – On November 2 at 6:05PM, officers responded to a residence located in the 8000 block of Knightshayes Dr. in Manassas (20111) to investigate an assault. The investigation revealed that a resident of the home and an acquaintance, identified as the accused, were involved in an altercation outside of the residence. During the encounter, another resident of the home, identified as a 41-year-old man, attempted to intervene and the parties eventually separated. After separating, the accused got into a vehicle and drove towards the male resident who was able to jump out of the way to avoid being struck before the accused drove off. No injuries were reported. Following the investigation, officers obtained arrest warrants for the accused, identified as Tanajah Imani **BROWN**. Initial attempts to locate the accused were unsuccessful. On November 15, the accused was located in the Woodbridge area and taken into custody without incident.

Possession of a Firearm on School Property – On November 16 at 8:51AM, a School Resource Officer (SRO) was informed by school security at Hampton Middle School, located at 14800 Darbydale Ave. in Woodbridge (22193), that a student was in possession of a weapon on school property. School security notified the SRO that upon receiving the information, an unloaded firearm was located in the locker of a student, a 12-year-old boy. While investigating, a BB gun was located in the locker of another student, an 11-year-old boy. Neither weapon was ever brandished towards other students or part of any active threat. The SRO took possession of both weapons, and the boys were released to family members. On November 17, following the investigation, the SRO obtained petitions for the **12-year-old boy** who was in possession of the real firearm. The case will be handled by juvenile court services.
