PW 4-H Healthy Living Community Night

Last Wednesday, Prince William teens enjoyed an interactive night of discovering the many aspects of the 4-H Healthy Living Pillar. Participants explored the 4-H's through yoga, reflected on the importance of stretching and warming up before exercising, played a game matching calories to food items to understand caloric needs, used target exercises to discover how different types of movements impact different parts of the body, and ended with a discussion on mental health and overall healthy habits to improve their everyday lives. Prince William 4-H will be expanding the discussion using the 4-H program *Health Rocks!*, which instills in youth participants confidence and communication skills necessary to develop the internal strength to resist risky behaviors. 4-H Teens ages 14 and up should consider applying for a Counselor in Training or Camp Counselor position. Those who have attended camp in previous years are preferred, but it is not a requirement. Applications will be accepted through January 1st with interviews being conducted through the early part of January. Final selection of camp leadership will be completed by the end of January. Teens selected as counselors are expected to attend monthly leadership sessions in addition to camp training in July. All dates will be announced upon final staff selections.





Born out of the 2021 historic floods in Eastern Kentucky, the Kentucky 4-H'ers helping 4-H'ers is a relief fund setup by the Foundation to support 4-H members through major disasters such as a flood, tornado, loss of home due to fire, or serious illness. Donations made to the fund will be disbursed to meet the needs of 4-H'ers and their families. The disbursement of these fund will be determined by the Kentucky 4-H Foundation along with University and Extension Staff. Currently, contributions are being raised to support 4-H members and families from counties facing significant loss from the December 2021 tornadoes. Any funds not utilized for these efforts will remain in the fund for the future needs or 4-H'ers.

The Graves County 4-H program (one of the counties hardest hit) has suggested the list on the side for needed items that could be shipped directly. The Mayfield donation hub is currently located at Catalyst-Mayfield, 114 Kings Drive, Mayfield, KY 42066.
