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4-H Civic Engagement: Follow the New Virginia 4-H Bill!



We have a unique opportunity this year to follow a grassroots 4-H bill through our state legislature. This past summer, Harper Miller, a Southwest Virginia 4-H Ambassador, contacted her legislator with the need that 4-H members should be excused from school to participate in a 4-H program or activity or event. This 4-H teen is currently working with two legislators (one in the House and one in the Senate) to draft proposed bills for the 2022 General Assembly to consider. The bills are HB 246 and SB 596: School attendance; 4-H educational programs and activities. This is a wonderful opportunity for us to help our 4-H'ers learn the legislative process as they "watch" how a bill that affects them goes through the various stages of possibly becoming a law.

Challenge your culinary skills! The **Prince William 4-H Food Challenge** is an exciting opportunity for youth to learn how to prepare nutritious and safe meals and snacks and adopt behaviors that can help reduce their risk for chronic disease. This contest challenges teams of 3-4 4-H members to create a dish using only a predetermined set of ingredients within 40 minutes. From these ingredients, team members must identify and prepare the dish, then present it to a team of judges.

GOALS

- To exhibit knowledge and skill when preparing and presenting a dish
- To utilize teamwork and leadership skills
- To demonstrate public speaking skills

HOW ARE TEAMS JUDGED

Teams are judged on preparation and presentation to encourage learning and improvement based on a National 4-H rubric. Judging categories include: knowledge of *MyPlate*, nutrition knowledge, food preparation, safety practices, serving size, food appearance and quality, creativity, communications, and ability to respond to questions.




