This is the official State 4-H Skill-A-Thon with the highest placing Senior 4-H Team moving on to the National 4-H Skill-A-Thon in Louisville, Kentucky in mid-November. FFA youth and teams are welcome to compete. This is not a dual-entry contest and there are not separate 4-H and FFA contests - one contest with two divisions (Junior and Senior, based on birthdate).

The State Skill-A-Thon contest is a comprehensive test of livestock knowledge including identification classes of meats, feeds, equipment and breeds; evaluation classes of meats, hay, sheep, swine, and beef; a knowledge-based quiz; and an applied team problem.

Please read the contest components carefully. Note that for Senior Contestants and Teams, the components are different than a traditional Stockman's contest, and there are three team activities, versus one in the traditional Stockman's contest.

The training gives you the skills you need to reach out and provide initial help and support to a youth who may be developing a mental health or substance use problem or experiencing a crisis. Mental Health First Aiders are... teachers, first responders and coaches. They're neighbors, parents and friends. They're people in recovery and those supporting a loved one. They're faith leaders and bus drivers. Mental Health First Aiders are anyone who wants to make their community healthier, happier and safer for youth.

States' 4-H International Exchange Program

International exchanges through States' 4-H is an invaluable opportunity to build connection, cultural awareness, and global citizenship. Check out the Summer Programs below and click here to learn more.

Short-Term Summer Program: Inbound Exchange

States' 4-H Summer Inbound programs bring youth to the US each summer to stay with a host family for 4 weeks. Based on a complete cultural immersion model, youth are matched with a volunteer American family who wants to share their life with an international visitor.



Visiting youth travel in groups and are accompanied by an adult chaperone who stays in the same state for the duration of the program. Host families will have the opportunity to participate in welcome orientations and departure events that are organized by the 4-H Extension office in each state.

States' 4-H currently offers several different hosting opportunities for interested families. The Japan Program is our largest and is always in need of families. Please note that space may be limited in our other programs.

Short-Term Summer Program: Outbound Exchange

States' 4-H Summer Outbound programs provide American 4-H youth with the opportunity to travel to foreign countries for a cultural immersion experience. Outbound delegates live with volunteer host families and engage in experiential learning about a new way of life. Delegates experience aspects of daily life that allow them to more deeply understand both their host culture and their own culture. The States' 4-H network of like-minded international partners recruit host families and plan enrichment activities for the delegation.

All States' 4-H Outbound delegates participate in pre-departure orientations held in the US. Delegations are accompanied by adult chaperones who remain in-country to provide support during the exchange. Delegates attend an in-country orientation upon arrival and prior to departing for their host families. Some programs include a summer camp or language learning elements as well.
