Trigger Time 4-H Shooting Education Club

Trigger Time 4-H Shooting Education Club defeats East Surry AJROTC

March 6, 2022- Trigger Time 4-H Shooting Education Club defeated East Surry AJROTC 813.7 to 784.7 in the 2022 National Air Rifle New Shooter League. They currently have a 2 - 2 record. Trigger Time 4-H Shooting Education Club was led by, Ayden Strand who shot a 210.8. The remaining contributing members were Kaiden Titcomb, Nora Wallschlaeger, and Colin White. Trigger Time 4-H Shooting Education Club is from Bristow, VA, and is coached by Alan Lerch.

Snapping a two game win streak East Surry AJROTC currently has a 2 - 4 record. East Surry AJROTC was led by, Colby Stowers who shot a 212.2. The remaining contributing members were Dylan Myers, Isacc McCormick, and Michael Needham. East Surry AJROTC is from Pilot Mountain, NC, and is coached by Robert Sentell.

Next up Trigger Time 4-H Shooting Education Club will compete against Bob Jones AFJROTC from Madison, AL. Bob Jones AFJROTC currently has a 3 - 2 record. While East Surry AJROTC has a bye week.

These two teams are competing in the National Air Rifle "New Shooter" League. Sponsored by the Orion Scoring System, the league is a national team league exclusive to athletes in their first year of competition. Teams are from high schools and junior rifle clubs throughout the United States. Over 10 weeks each team competes in 8 games. Each week, each team is paired with another team with a near equal skill level.

In each game the teams compete in what is known as a Three-Position Air Rifle match. The match is modeled after Olympic Rifle competitions but adapted to high school age athletes. Each athlete will shoots 10 shots in three different shooting positions, prone, standing, and kneeling. Each shot is worth a maximum of 10.9 points. The sum of points scored in the 30 shots is the athlete's total. The team score is comprised of the best four athletes from each team.

They are required to donate a purebred heifer calf back to the program within two years, and give a presentation on their experience. This is the official State 4-H Skill-A-Thon with the highest placing Senior 4-H Team moving on to the National 4-H Skill-A-Thon in Louisville, Kentucky in mid-November. FFA youth and teams are welcome to compete. This is not a dual-entry contest and there are not separate 4-H and FFA contests - one contest with two divisions (Junior and Senior, based on birthdate).

The State Skill-A-Thon contest is a comprehensive test of livestock knowledge including identification classes of meats, feeds, equipment and breeds; evaluation classes of meats, hay, sheep, swine, and beef; a knowledge-based quiz; and an applied team problem.

Please read the contest components carefully. Note that for Senior Contestants and Teams, the components are different than a traditional Stockman's contest, and there are three team activities, versus one in the traditional Stockman's contest.

Updated VCE/4-H COVID-19 Guidelines (as of March 2022)

There is now one guidance document for the entire Virginia Cooperative Extension system, including 4-H. The following details the expectation for masks/face coverings for all VCE programs. To help determine the expectations of masks/face coverings, please use the following question in your decision-making process.

Is the program being held on Virginia Tech owned property?



• If no - no masks required, personal preference. Monitor your COVID-19 Community Level and follow your local or CDC mask guidance. (High = masks are required. Medium/Low = no masks required; personal preference)

If yes - what is the current COVID-19 community level? (i.e. community level high=mask required in VT facilities; community level low/moderate=personal preference)

Virginia Tech Virginia State University

The COVID-19 Community Level data is updated once per week and faculty/staff organizing events on Virginia Tech owned property will include expectations for mask/face coverings in event details. Creating a sense of belonging and a welcoming environment is a foundational principle of 4-H positive youth development. To that end, we will support and make all individuals that choose to wear a mask/face covering feel welcome.
