The Prince William Health District What You Should Know

VDH Recommends COVID-19 Testing For The Following People:

- People who have symptoms of COVID-19.
- People who have come into <u>close contact</u> with someone with COVID-19 should be tested to check for infection at least 5 days after they last had close contact with someone with COVID-19. The date of the last close contact is considered day 0.
- People who are not <u>up to date with their COVID-19 vaccines</u> who are prioritized for expanded community screening for COVID-19.
- People regardless of vaccination status who have been asked or referred to get testing by their school, workplace, healthcare provider, state, tribal, local, or territorial health department.
- People who plan to <u>travel</u> or who have recently returned from travel with <u>some</u> exceptions for fully vaccinated people
- If possible, people who participate in activities that are higher risk for COVID-19 exposure (e.g. attending large events where social distancing is not possible, or being in crowded indoor settings).
- If possible, people who plan to visit someone at high-risk for developing severe COVID-19.
