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4-H'ers Field Trip to the Farmer's Market



At Prince William 4-H, we learn by doing!

Last Saturday, the Prince William 4-H young entrepreneurs visited a local Farmer's Market. They had two activities to complete and gather take-away ideas for their business.

The first activity was a scavenger hunt. 4-H'ers looked for items similar to their products, pricing, packaging, table displays, and what the customers were actually picking up and buying.

The second activity was to interview a vendor. Each 4-H'er found a business that sells a similar item to their new business. The

youth asked questions to gain

insight into where the vendor got the idea for their business, how to prepare for market, best selling items, marketing strategies, and their business challenges. Youth ended the interview by asking for specific advice that the vendors would give to youth as they launch their new businesses.

The 4-H'ers enjoyed exploring the market and gained an understanding of how to setup their tables and showcase their products to bring in customers and increase sales.



At tonight's workshop, each young entrepreneur will be presenting their business plan. Elizabeth Long, owner of Color Puff Candy, will be coming in to talk about her own business and give feedback on each business plan.



Prince William 4-H Clubs provide a place where youth can belong and grow!




4-H Clubs are open to youth ages 5-19. They can be established in-school, after school, or as independent clubs, and can be teacher or volunteer led.

YOVASO Summer Leadership Retreat

The four-day, three-night retreat offers a variety of educational and hands-on activities designed for teens who want to learn how to be safer drivers and passengers, as well as teens who want to train as leaders for youth traffic safety. The Retreat is sponsored by Youth of Virginia Speak Out About Traffic Safety (YOVASO), a program of the Virginia State Police (VSP).

The cost is \$15 per teen to attend and includes overnight accommodations, meals, sessions, and all materials needed to participate in the Retreat. Participants will also receive a retreat-themed t-shirt, backpack, lanyard, and water bottle. Community youth groups, church youth groups, and school clubs are also encouraged to register and may register up to 6 students and I adult advisor for a discounted fee of \$75.

The retreat provides a unique experience for teens interested in community service or careers in health and safety, law enforcement, or teaching. Teens will leave the retreat prepared to lead peer-to-peer programs in their schools or through community youth groups to promote safe teen driving and help prevent motor vehicle crashes among teens. Additionally the retreat offers a variety of educational and hands-on activities.

Some highlights of the retreat include:

- Motivational speaker, Fletcher Cleaves on "The SKy is Not the Limit"
- A live simulated crash and mock trauma bay presented by VCU Health's Project IMPACT
- Personal stories by crash victims and family members who've lost a loved one to a crash
- Workshops on public speaking and the power of advocacy
- A multi-media TjohnE Trivia Game Show


There will be interactive safety sessions by:

- Virginia State Police's K-9 Unit
- Virginia State Police's Distracted Driving Simulator Program
- American Trucking Association
- VDOT on Work Zone Safety
- Operation Lifesaver on railroad safety
- And many more!

Teens will also enjoy a variety of interactive, teambuilding social events, to include a glow stick game, talent show, and the Amazing Race, "Safari" style.

Registration will close on June 26. Teens who register for the retreat and refer a friend to attend (who registers) will be entered into a drawing for a \$25 Amazon gift card!

The Retreat is sponsored by YOVASO, VSP, and the Virginia Department of Motor Vehicles in partnership with State Farm Insurance. YOVASO is Virginia's Peer-to-Peer Education and Prevention Program for Teen Driver and Passenger Safety. Membership in YOVASO is free and open to all Virginia high schools, middle schools, and youth groups.
