**STEP 2: Tell the 4-H Story** and invite families to join the new club by promoting the opportunities available through 4-H. Encourage adult volunteers to assist in specific club responsibilities.

**STEP 3: Conduct 4-H Club Meetings** and encourage youth to create a club name, establish meeting times, develop an annual plan, organize projects, and elect youth club officers.

Entry fees are \$20/head through Thursday, June 23rd and late entries are accepted through check-in day of show for \$30/head. All entries, even day of entries, must be submitted using the FairEntry system and must be completed prior to arriving for check-in. All exhibitors will be pre-entered in Showmanship, based on birth date/age, but may scratch the day of, if they choose.

\*This show is a Qualifying Show for the Virginia Showmasters Circuit and showmanship placings will be forwarded to the VSC for points accumulation for those youth who are registered VSC members \*\*It is a VIRGINIA-ONLY show and there is not a PeeWee Division.

# **YOVASO Summer Leadership Retreat**

#### Dates: July 14th—17th Location: James Madison University, Harrisonburg, VA Who Should Attend: 4-H'ers who are rising 9th through 12th Graders Register by June 26th. <u>Click here for more information and to register</u>.

The four-day, three-night retreat offers a variety of educational and hands-on activities designed for teens who want to learn how to be safer drivers and passengers, as well as teens who want to train as leaders for youth traffic safety. The Retreat is sponsored by Youth of Virginia Speak Out About Traffic Safety (YOVASO), a program of the Virginia State Police (VSP).

The cost is \$15 per teen to attend and includes overnight accommodations, meals, sessions, and all materials needed to participate in the Retreat. Participants will also receive a retreat-themed t-shirt, backpack, lanyard, and water bottle. Community youth groups, church youth groups, and school clubs are also encouraged to register and may register up to 6 students and 1 adult advisor for a discounted fee of \$75.

The retreat provides a unique experience for teens interested in community service or careers in health and safety, law enforcement, or teaching. Teens will leave the retreat prepared to lead peer-to-peer programs in their schools or through community youth groups to promote safe teen driving and help prevent motor vehicle crashes among teens. Additionally the retreat offers a variety of educational and hands-on activities.

#### Some highlights of the retreat include:

- Motivational speaker, Fletcher Cleaves on "The SKy is Not the Limit"
- A live simulated crash and mock trauma bay presented by VCU Health's Project IMPACT
- Personal stories by crash victims and family members who've lost a loved one to a crash
- Workshops on public speaking and the power of advocacy
- A multi-media TjohnE Trivia Game Show

#### There will be interactive safety sessions by:

- Virginia State Police's Crash Reconstruction Team
- Virginia State Police's K-9 Unit
- Virginia State Police's Distracted Driving Simulator Program
- American Trucking Association
- VDOT on Work Zone Safety
- Operation Lifesaver on railroad safety
- And many more!

Teens will also enjoy a variety of interactive, teambuilding social events, to include a glow stick game, talent show, and the Amazing Race, "Safari" style.

Registration will close on June 26. Teens who register for the retreat and refer a friend to attend (who registers) will be entered into a drawing for a \$25 Amazon gift card!

The Retreat is sponsored by YOVASO, VSP, and the Virginia Department of Motor Vehicles in partnership with State Farm Insurance. YOVASO is Virginia's Peer-to -Peer Education and Prevention Program for Teen Driver and Passenger Safety. Membership in YOVASO is free and open to all Virginia high schools, middle schools, and youth groups.
