Prince William 4-H Clubs provide a place where youth can belong and grow!




4-H Clubs are open to youth ages 5-19. They can be established in-school, after school, or as independent clubs, and can be teacher or volunteer led.

STARTING A 4-H CLUB

You can start a 4-H Club in 4 EASY STEPS:

STEP 1: Contact the Prince William County 4-H Office and attend the September leadership training session.

STEP 2: Tell the 4-H Story and invite families to join the new club by promoting the opportunities available through 4-H.

Encourage adult volunteers to assist in specific club responsibilities.

STEP 3: Conduct 4-H Club Meetings and encourage youth to create a club name, establish meeting times, develop an annual plan, organize projects, and elect youth club officers.

STEP 4: Keep the 4-H Club Strong by conducting regular meetings, establishing good communications, getting involved in local, state and national 4-H activities, recognizing achievements, participating in community service, and building community relations.

Connie Collier 4-H Scholarship Application Due July 18th

The Connie Collier 4-H Scholarship Award will provide monies to Virginia 4-H Horse Program participants who have met the 4-H horse program requirements and pursue post-secondary education before the age of twenty-five. Applicants must be enrolled in 4-H at the Senior Level (14-19) and must be enrolled in their second year of the 4-H Horse Program. Recipients shall be chosen by the Virginia 4-H Horse Program Scholarship Fund Committee through a competitive process based on the information requested in the application guidelines. Top candidates may be invited to interview as deemed necessary by the awards committee.



Southern Regional 4-H Horse Championships

The Southern Regional 4-H Horse Championships is a 12 state horse and educational event for 4-H members. Please note that in all classes, Juniors and Seniors compete together as do horses and ponies. The pony jumping classes are adjusted for height. Youth/horse combos can enter only one showmanship and one conformation class, but may enter as many of the under-saddle classes as the horse can perform.

Get Ready for the 2022 4-H STEM Challenge: Explorers of the Deep

Click here to preorder Explorers of the Deep STEM Kits by August 1st!

Designed by Rutgers University, Explorers of the Deep, focuses on the mysteries and adventures of ocean exploration—with robots! Ocean exploration helps scientists prepare for and adapt to changing ocean conditions. Many of these changes in ocean conditions are affecting the environment, such as melting glaciers, increasing ocean temperatures, declining fisheries and an increase in frequency and severity of storms. Since Earth is an ocean planet, these impacts affect humans and organisms all around the world, regardless of their proximity to the ocean.

The three activities develop observational and critical thinking skills while exploring the interconnected nature between the ocean and humans, regardless of where they live. Youth will learn about the incredibly complex relationship between Earth's oceans and the global climate. According to a recent survey, 84 percent of teens would like to be involved with shaping the future of our environment and Explorers of the Deep can help empower young people to innovate and take action to drive positive change.

Ocean Robot Test Tank: Get your ocean robot ready for a research mission! Youth learn how to "ballast" their ocean robot by adding weights to create the sinking and floating behavior of a real ocean robot. They will investigate data collected by ocean robots and learn about the value of ocean exploration.

Ocean Expedition: Playing an ocean-inspired board game, youth navigate their ocean robot around the world while learning key ocean concepts such as aquaculture, climate change, technological innovation, human impact and the ocean ecosystem.

Ocean Communicator: Youth investigate challenges that ocean scientists, engineers and technologists are currently exploring. Each challenge requires innovations and technical solutions that inspire public action.
