Trigger Time 4-H Shooting Education Club Earns First Place at the 2022 Centreville Cup

October 23, 2022 - Trigger Time 4-H Shooting Education Club had five athletes participate in the 2022 Centreville Cup at the Arlington Fairfax IWLA. In the individual category, Samantha Erick earned the title of "Sporter Cup Champion" finishing 1st place with a score of 541, Alexis Strand finished 3rd place with a 522, Sam Seagle finished 5th place with a 518, Rebecca Ahrens finished 11th place with a 491, and Ayden Strand finished 18th place with a 404. In the team category, Trigger Time finished first place with a score of 2072 with 44 bullseyes. Great job team.

Webb City AJROTC defeats Trigger Time 4-H Shooting Education Club

October 18, 2022 - Both teams shooting their highest score of the season, Webb City AJROTC barely edged out Trigger Time 4-H Shooting Education Club 1120.5 to 1117.5 last week in the National Air Rifle League. Shooting their highest team score of the season Trigger Time 4-H Shooting Education Club was led by Samantha Erick who shot a 283.6. The remaining contributing members were Noah Richter who shot a 282.1, Grace Richter who shot a 279.6, and Samantha Seagle who shot a 272.2. Trigger Time 4-H Shooting Education Club is competing in the Champions Division where they are currently ranked in thirteenth place. They have a 2-2 record.

SHOOTING SPORTS

Deadline for 7-year Recertification for Shooting Education Instructors is Due TODAY!

Shooting Education Instructors must be Recertified every 7 years in each discipline they are certified to instruct. This is a requirement to comply with the National Standards published by the National 4-H Shooting Sports Committee. The Virginia 4-H Shooting Education recertification program adheres to those requirements. Our policy has been approved by the VA 4-H Shooting Education Council, VT Risk Management, and the VCE Admin Team.

- There are approximately 160 instructors that need to be recertified in one or more disciplines. Those that have not completed recertification by the 12/31/2023 deadline will be de-certified. There are 3 sessions remaining before the deadline: November 5, 2022; February 2023; and November 2023.
- We need at least 40-50 instructors to attend each session. Those that wait for the last session may be turned away.
- An instructor can attain recertification in three disciplines in one day.
- A few instructors will need to attend a second session to get their recertification in a fourth or fifth discipline.
- There will be 3 classes per day for each discipline. Class sizes will vary by discipline, and the maximum class size will be strictly enforced for safety reasons.
- Costs are as follows: One discipline \$50; Two disciplines \$70; Three disciplines \$90; Costs include lunch, 3-ring binder with current curricula, ammo, etc.
- Lodging is available at Holiday Lake 4-H Center if desired, \$25 per night
- The recertifications are conducted by Level II instructors who are valuable volunteers. These are the same volunteers that conduct multiple training and competition events throughout the year.


