


Embryology Project

The "Beginning of Life" 4-H Project is designed to help youth obtain a better understanding of life and embryonic development. 4-H educational materials guide students through each step of the hatching process from preparing the eggs for incubation to building a brooder for the newly hatched chicks. These educational materials address Standards of Learning (SOLs) for math, science, English, life science, and computer technology. 4-H will provide fertilized eggs, guide you through training, support you during the hatch, and then collect the chicks to be sent to a local farm.





An introductory program, 4-H members and interested youth from the Northeast 4-H District and surrounding Counties are invited to come and experience components of the state educational contests collectively known as EquiSmartz. This clinic includes sessions in Horse Bowl. Hippology, and Horse Judging. Youth will learn the basic format of the contests and types of questions presented, plus participate in a minipractice contest for each component (no awards). Club leaders, parents, and volunteers participate in a concurrent session for instruction on how to organize teams for EquiSmartz and to share ideas. Youth must have a designated adult chaperone on site. Live horse judging will be at Greenfield Farm, 11218 Cross Corner Rd, Ashland, VA for afternoon session. All attendees must provide their own transportation.



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


National 4-H Shooting Sports Quiz Bowl

Registration for the 2023 4-H Shooting Sports Quiz Bowl is open for both teams and individuals. Teams consist of 3 or 4 members, with the highest three scores counting as the Team Score. Team members will automatically be re registered in the Individual Competition as well as the Team Competition. Quiz Can be taken anytime between January 16th and January 20th. Scores will be based on the number of correct answers and the amount of time it takes to complete the quiz. Study resources are available for archer, hunting skills, muzzle loading, pistol, rifle, shotgun, western heritage, and general information.

2023 4-H Zooming Into Wildlife Sessions



Trail cameras are a great way to explore wildlife habits and learn about the environment outdoors. This unique series will give youth the opportunity to use a trail camera while meeting weekly over Zoom to share their captured footage and hear from guest speakers.

Youth who sign up will have the opportunity to purchase an affordable trail camera when they register if they do not currently have one, but it's not a requirement to participate. Youth can register just to participate in the Zoom sessions and hear from the speakers.

This is open to all 4-H members in Minnesota 4-H with an "active" enrollment status, as well as 4-H members from other states. The "Zooming In on Wildlife" 2023 Series is geared towards youth 4th grade and

up, but younger 4-H members can participate with parental guidance.

If you already have a trail camera or just want to participate in the Zoom sessions without a trail camera, there is no cost. If you wish to purchase a trail camera, the cost is \$45.00. Checks should be made out to Waseca County 4-H and mailed in/dropped off to the county Extension Office (300 N State St, Waseca MN 56093). Trail cameras will be shipped directly to participants' homes once payment is received.

VCE Transitioning Land & Farm Businesses

The opportunity for producers, business and landowners to learn and focus on farm transition planning is here! With most farms in Virginia being family owned and operated, it is very important to take the time to discuss the future. Please mark your calendars to join us at one of four locations (Culpeper, Wytheville, Weyers Cave, Dinwiddie) across the state for an interactive workshop the week of February 20-23, 2023 to join Dick Wittman of Wittman Consulting. Dick has worked for Farm Credit Administration, successfully managed and transitioned his family's multi-generation farm/ranch, helped family farm businesses as a consultant for three decades, and authored a guidebook titled Building Effective Farm Management Systems.

This workshop will be of interest for folks who are facing many different scenarios when it comes to transition. Some farms hope to transition ownership and management to next generation successors. But what if the successors have limited or no capital and want to work on the farm, hoping to assume ownership later. How do you as owners get "out of the way" but "not go away?". What if your successors don't want to work on the farm, but they don't want you to sell their heritage? Come prepared to look at transition strategies that can be adapted to a multitude of scenarios. A case study workshop will immerse participants in real-world transition scenarios that will provide take home experience and build confidence in how to move forward.
