Today's youth are our future leaders. How can you be a good citizen and help your community to learn, grow, and support the changing needs of the world around you?

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

Prince William 4-H Teens ages 14 and up are encouraged to apply for a camp counselor position for Prince William/Stafford 4-H Junior Camp summer of 2023! Before applying, please consider carefully why you want to be considered for this role. If you are selected, you will be expected to work hard and demonstrate mature and responsible behavior throughout the entire week of camp. You must be willing to set a good example with your actions and attitude. 
Embryology Project

The "Beginning of Life" 4-H Project is designed to help youth obtain a better understanding of life and embryonic development. 4-H educational materials guide students through each step of the hatching process from preparing the eggs for incubation to building a brooder for the newly hatched chicks. These educational materials address Standards of Learning (SOLs) for math, science, English, life science, and computer technology. 4-H will provide fertilized eggs, guide you through training, support you during the hatch, and then collect the chicks to be sent to a local farm.





Bill will show us how to accurately identify local snake species, review best practices on how you can limit snakes from coming onto your property and/or into your house, and talk about the venomous snakes of Virginia.

2023 4-H Zooming Into Wildlife Sessions



Trail cameras are a great way to explore wildlife habits and learn about the environment outdoors. This unique series will give youth the opportunity to use a trail camera while meeting weekly over Zoom to share their captured footage and hear from guest speakers.

Youth who sign up will have the opportunity to purchase an affordable trail camera when they register if they do not currently have one, but it's not a requirement to participate. Youth can register just to participate in the Zoom sessions and hear from the speakers.

This is open to all 4-H members in Minnesota 4-H with an "active" enrollment status, as well as 4-H members from other states. The "Zooming In on Wildlife" 2023 Series is geared towards youth 4th grade and

up, but younger 4-H members can participate with parental guidance.

If you already have a trail camera or just want to participate in the Zoom sessions without a trail camera, there is no cost. If you wish to purchase a trail camera, the cost is \$45.00. Checks should be made out to Waseca County 4-H and mailed in/dropped off to the county Extension Office (300 N State St, Waseca MN 56093). Trail cameras will be shipped directly to participants' homes once payment is received.

WHO MAKES A GOOD FRIEND?

It's not always easy to know if someone we consider a friend really is someone we can rely on to have our best interest at heart. In this activity, you'll discover what really makes a good friend, consider the influences your friends have on you, and be challenged to think about how to take care of yourself if someone is not being a good friend to you.



IS THAT A FACT?

We often think we know things are true, and often we don't even question them. But In this activity, you'll learn to tell the difference between a fact and an assumption—and challenge some common assumptions about teen tobacco, alcohol, and drug use.



STRESS WEIGHING YOU DOWN?

Frontiers for Young Minds - Science for Kids, Edited by Kids

The Washington Post featured an article on *Frontiers for Young Minds* in yesterday's newspaper. This open-access, online scientific journal is written by scientists and reviewed by a board of youth ages 8-15.
