Last Thursday, our Prince William 4-H teens met to explore citizenship and prepare for Virginia 4-H Day at the Capitol. We started with an exciting game of *Heads-Up*, giving clues to various historical figures and government terms. Then we discussed citizenship, how to become a citizen, and we even tested ourselves using the 100 questions on the US Citizenship & Immigration Services naturalization sample questions (click here and see how TTEZENSTIP you would do!) We had a lot of dialog on selective service and why Virginia is a

commonwealth.

We also went into detail on what is a bill, how to write a bill, watched "I'm Just a Bill" video, and learned about Virginia 4-H youth Harper Miller and her successful journey to pass a bill in favor of excused absences for Virginia 4-H activities. Our 4-H'ers had great ideas on bills they would like to see passed and questions for our legislators.



Prince William 4-H Teens ages 14 and up are encouraged to apply for a camp counselor position for Prince William/Stafford 4-H Junior Camp summer of 2023! Before applying, please consider carefully why you want to be considered for this role. If you are selected, you will be expected to work hard the demonstrate mature and responsible behavior throughout the entire week of camp. You must be willing to set a good example with your actions and attitude. You will not have a lot of free time to only socialize with your friends, but you will have plenty of time to get to know your campers and mentor and lead them. You can expect to learn a great deal about yourself and others and acquire skills that will serve you for a lifetime. You will also be expected to have some fun!

Applications are due by January 20th. Teens selected as counselors are expected to attend monthly leadership sessions in addition to camp training in July. All dates will be announced upon final staff selections.

The "Beginning of Life" 4-H Project is designed to help youth obtain a better understanding of life and embryonic development. 4-H educational materials guide students through each step of the hatching process from preparing the eggs for incubation to building a brooder for the newly hatched chicks. These educational materials address Standards of Learning (SOLs) for math, science, English, life science, and computer technology. 4-H will provide fertilized eggs, guide you through training, support you during the hatch, and then collect the chicks to be sent to a local farm.

Trail cameras are a great way to explore wildlife habits and learn about the environment outdoors. This unique series will give youth the opportunity to use a trail camera while meeting weekly over Zoom to share their

captured footage and hear from guest speakers. This program is open to all 4-H members in Minnesota 4-H with an "active" enrollment status, as well as 4-H members from other states. The Zooming In on Wildlife 2023 series is geared towards youth in grades 4 and up, but younger 4-H members can participate with parental guidance.

A trail camera is not a requirement to participate. Youth can register to just participate in the Zoom sessions to hear from the speakers. If you already have a trail camera or just want to participate in the Zoom sessions without a trail camera, there is no cost. If you wish to purchase a trail camera, the cost is \$45.00.

Charcuterie have boards popularity. skyrocketed in Whether it is filled with sweet treats or savory goodies, the possibilities for a charcuterie board are endless! The board pictured to the right is a healthy and diet-indusive take on the trend. Here are some examples to lead you in creating a charcuterie board that is pleasing to the eye and nourishing to the body! First, start off with some fruits! My board features kiwis, blueberries, and raspberries! Next, get some veggies on your board;



such as cellery and sliced red pepper. If you don't particularly enjoy the taste of veggies alone, dip them in a protein-based spread like peanut butter! Dairy can be a little tricky with allergies, so do not be afraid to substitute or try something new! This board features a small wheel of mozzarella and vegan feta cheese. To include fiber on your board, add some crackers or toasted whole-grain bread. If you are gluten-free, try an alternative such as rice thins. Your bread can be somewhat boring without a spread, so I encourage you to try a new jelly or jam; such as red pepper jelly, which paired very well with the rice thins!
