The Association welcomed new adult volunteer secretary Mary McDonald who quickly turned around the draft minutes linked above. Fundraising to support the Prince William 4-H program camps, scholarships, and youth activities is a vital aspect of the Association. Sam Whysong presented a number of ideas for the Fundraising Committee to consider. We will be participating in Wreaths Across America again this year, an important community service event that also provides a fundraising opportunity for our program. Members discussed the pros and cons of another quilt auction. The Recognition Committee proposed ideas for Prince William 4-H Recognition Day.

New business included a discussion of a spring picnic and review of Engage Locally. Members were enthusiastic about a picnic and will be discussing at the next meeting. The Virginia Department of Forestry and Virginia Cooperative Extension are providing free hardwood seedlings to schools and youth groups. The purpose of this project is to improve water quality by restoring forest cover to residential and riparian lands. Prince William 4-H is offering tree seedlings (American Elderberry, Red Mulberry, and Sweetgum) to youth educators for planting projects in the community. The Prince William 4-H Tree Seedling Project relates to many science, math and history Virginia SOLs. Please note that this project is not intended for youth to bring home trees.





DID YOU KNOW...

According to the Virginia Farm Bureau, agriculture and forestry were Virginia's first industries, and are still the cornerstone of our state's economy. The industries of agriculture and forestry together have a total economic impact of \$105 billion and provide more than 490,000 jobs in the commonwealth. Every job in agriculture and forestry supports 1.6 jobs elsewhere in Virginia's economy.

Most Virginians live in cities or towns. Trees in yards, along the streets and parking lots and throughout the parks and trails make up an urban forest and so there is a need for urban foresters. VCE hires urban foresters but also trains citizen volunteers to take care of trees. 4-H can make a difference.







Alan Spivey, the voice of the VA State 4-H Horse Show and a longtime 4-H Volunteer, passed away unexpectedly on Oct. 13, 2022. Applications are now open for the 2024 National 4-H Youth in Action Awards sponsored by National 4-H Council. This application is separate from the Virginia 4-H Youth in Action Awards that are given at our Evening with Virginia 4-H event.

The national awards were previously awarded in the fall, but National 4-H Council decided to change the application time frame to the spring, because they received feedback that this is when students are more likely to apply for awards and scholarships.

Four award winners will be selected. In addition to other benefits, each will receive a \$5,000 scholarship, a trip to Washington, DC, and recognition at a National 4-H Council event. Any 4-H member age 15-19 is eligible to apply. All applicants will receive media, interview, and storytelling training from National 4-H professionals; and admission into the national 4-H story database; providing potential national multi-media and spokesperson opportunities.

Virginia 4-H Beekeeping Essay Contest



Sponsored by The Foundation for the Preservation of Honey Bees, Inc. & Virginia 4-H

Awards: Cash Prizes to 3 Top State Winners at these levels: 1st-\$100, 2nd-\$50, 3rd-\$25

State winner will be forwarded on to National competition: Ist - \$750, 2nd-\$500, 3rd-\$250

* Each state winner, including the national winners, receives an appropriate book about honey bees, beekeeping, or honey.

2023 ESSAY TOPIC: THE IMPORTANCE OF BEESWAX

Although honey bees are much-beloved for honey, bees also produce beeswax that can be used in many ways. For this essay, a 4-H student should discuss why beeswax is so important to the hive (it's a pantry, it's a nursery, it's the dance floor), but also discuss their favorite way to use beeswax outside the hive. Photos of candles, soaps, or lip balms that are made to show the 4-H'er's skill in using beeswax are welcomed as are recipes or brief instructions.

Put on your thinking caps and GO! An essential judging criterion is the scope of research you put forth in developing the ideas behind your essay—accounting for 40% of your score. The number of sources consulted, the authority of the sources and the variety of the sources are all evaluated. Personal interviews with beekeepers and others familiar with the subject are valued sources of information and should be documented. Note that "honey bee" is properly spelled as two words, even though many otherwise authoritative references spell it as one word.

Rules & Requirements:

- Contest is open to active 4-H Club members only. 4-H'ers who have previously placed first, second or third at the national level are not eligible; other state winners are eligible to re-enter.
- ELECTRONIC SUBMISSIONS ONLY, double spaced, 12-pt. Times or similar type style, following standard manuscript format. Submit as a Microsoft Word compatible document.
- Write on the designated subject only.
- All factual statements must be referenced with bibliographical-style endnotes.
- A brief biographical sketch of the essayist, including date of birth, gender, complete mailing address, and telephone number, must accompany the essay.
- Length the essay proper: 750-1000 words.
- The word count does not include the endnotes, the bibliography or references, nor the essayist's biographical sketch which should be on a separate page.
- Essays will be judged on (a) scope of research 40%; (b) accuracy 30%; (c) creativity 10%; (d) conciseness 10%; and (e) logical development of the topic 10%.

Essayists should forward essays to the state judging team postmarked by April 14, 2023. The winner of the state contest will be forwarded to the national competition before May 1.

The state winner will be announced on May 1, 2023 and the National Winner will be announced the week of June 15, 2023.

All National entries become the property of the Foundation and may be published or used as it sees fit. No essay will be returned. The National winners' essay will appear in an issue of the American Beekeeping Federation's Newsletter.


