Virginia 4-H Beekeeping Essay Contest



Sponsored by The Foundation for the Preservation of Honey Bees, Inc. & Virginia 4-H

Awards: Cash Prizes to 3 Top State Winners at these levels: 1st-\$100, 2nd-\$50, 3rd-\$25

State winner will be forwarded on to National competition: 1st - \$750, 2nd- \$500, 3rd- \$250

* Each state winner, including the national winners, receives an appropriate book about honey bees, beekeeping, or honey.

2023 ESSAY TOPIC: THE IMPORTANCE OF BEESWAX

Although honey bees are much-beloved for honey, bees also produce beeswax that can be used in many ways. For this essay, a 4-H student should discuss why beeswax is so important to the hive (it's a pantry, it's a nursery, it's the dance floor), but also discuss their favorite way to use beeswax outside the hive. Photos of candles, soaps, or lip balms that are made to show the 4-H'er's skill in using beeswax are welcomed as are recipes or brief instructions.

Put on your thinking caps and GO! An essential judging criterion is the scope of research you put forth in developing the ideas behind your essay—accounting for 40% of your score. The number of sources consulted, the authority of the sources and the variety of the sources are all evaluated. Personal interviews with beekeepers and others familiar with the subject are valued sources of information and should be documented. Note that "honey bee" is properly spelled as two words, even though many otherwise authoritative references spell it as one word.

Rules & Requirements:

- Contest is open to active 4-H Club members only. 4-H'ers who have previously placed first, second or third at the national level are not eligible; other state winners are eligible to re-enter.
- ELECTRONIC SUBMISSIONS ONLY, double spaced, 12-pt. Times or similar type style, following standard manuscript format. Submit as a Microsoft Word compatible document.
- Write on the designated subject only.
- All factual statements must be referenced with bibliographical-style endnotes.
- A brief biographical sketch of the essayist, including date of birth, gender, complete mailing address, and telephone number, must accompany the essay.
- Length the essay proper: 750-1000 words.
- The word count does not include the endnotes, the bibliography or references, nor the essayist's biographical sketch which should be on a separate page.
- Essays will be judged on (a) scope of research 40%; (b) accuracy 30%; (c) creativity 10%; (d) conciseness 10%; and (e) logical development of the topic 10%.

Essayists should forward essays to the state judging team postmarked by April 14, 2023. The winner of the state contest will be forwarded to the national competition before May 1.

The state winner will be announced on May 1, 2023 and the National Winner will be announced the week of June 15, 2023.

All National entries become the property of the Foundation and may be published or used as it sees fit. No essay will be returned. The National winners' essay will appear in an issue of the American Beekeeping Federation's Newsletter.

- You can host a youth aged 12-18 or an adult chaperone

HOST FAMILY REQUIREMENTS

- You must have a child of the same gender who is within 3 years of the hosted youth (children aged 9+ are eligible to host)
- Families without children of the appropriate age may host an adult chaperone
- No special activities need to be planned since these youth want to experience American culture, make new friends, and improve their English by staying with your family
- You don't need to be involved with 4-H to host

Companion Animals and Stress Management

As we head from midterms into the final sprint before finals, stress can be at an all-time high. Personally, I find comfort in my barn, taking care of my animals. Studies have shown that playing or cuddling with our furry (or feathered!) friends releases a chemical called oxytocin, the feel-good hormone that results from that social and relational interaction with animals. This is the same chemical a mother and baby bond produces! Playing with animals also causes a decrease in blood pressure, and cortisol—the stress hormone. These three factors provide relief for your nervous system and is a great healthy coping mechanism when feeling stressed. While most studies are focused on dogs, most pets still have the same benefits! Other studies concluded that they can also decrease feelings of loneliness, increase feelings of social support and boost overall mood and mental health!

To make your own geocache, start by finding an airtight container and placing small trinkets inside.
