Procedure for Addressing New Issues:

- 1. Threshold Analysis (must answer all in the affirmative)
 - a. Is it within the JET mandate?
 - b. Is it a feasible task for JET?
 - c. Will it have a substantial impact?
- 2. Identify Stakeholders
- 3. Request Staff Report on Current Status of Any Efforts
- 4. Request Briefing on Any Relevant Policy Issues
- 5. Seek Reports from Subject Matter Experts as Needed
- 6. Draft and Vote on Recommendations to the BOCS and School Board

Areas of Focus (not in any priority order):

- 1. Facilities/Infrastructure
 - a. High performance buildings.
 - b. Sustainable landscaping (including native plants and invasive plant management).
- 2. Transportation
 - a. Vehicle emissions management.
 - b. Walkability issues.
- 3. Workforce Development
 - a. Consolidation of best practices on sustainability.
 - b. Foster workforce ethic of sustainability.
 - c. Incorporate sustainability into job descriptions as appropriate.
 - d. Develop workforce skillset for new technologies focused on sustainability.
 - e. Support businesses that create sustainability ethic among workforces.
 - f. Promote student internships within the sustainability industry.
 - g. Promote citizenship efforts surrounding the impact of environmental conditions on human health.
- 4. Land Usage
 - a. Complementary siting issues.
 - b. Walkability issues.
- 5. Waste Management/Recycling
 - a. Increase focus on waste prevention.
 - b. Complementary siting of facilities for public use (e.g., composting, recycling)
- 6. Energy Usage permeates all categories above.
- 7. Procurement
 - a. Incorporation of sustainability considerations.
 - b. Collaborative/group purchasing.
