It is with excitement that we once again open applications to teen 4-H members who have an interest in healthy living to apply to serve as a Virginia 4-H Healthy Living Ambassador. As a Healthy Living Ambassador, meeting virtually once a month, participants will work together to plan a statewide Healthy Living Summit as well as develop the monthly Buzz, Body, and Bites newsletter for teens.

Specifically, the expectations for serving in this role include:

- Actively participating in monthly meetings (date and time will be determined as a group after Ambassadors are selected). More frequent meetings may be needed as we get closer to the Healthy Living Summit.
- Helping to plan and implement the Virginia 4-H Healthy Living Summit (date will be determined by the Ambassador team).
- Helping to write and edit the monthly Buzz, Body, and Bites Newsletter for Teens.
- Embodying the role of a Healthy Living Ambassador by being the youth voice in your community to advocate for healthy living.
- Informing 4-H youth, volunteers, and other interested persons about 4-H Healthy Living opportunities and resources.
- Sharing program ideas and resources with peers that will help strengthen and expand 4-H Healthy Living programs.
- Representing 4-H in a positive manner.

To qualify to serve as a Virginia 4-H Healthy Living Ambassador, you must:

- Be a teen 4-H member (between the ages of 14-18) and active in 4HOnline.
- Have a passion for and active engagement in 4-H Healthy Living.
- Have an interest in sharing knowledge to enhance youth educational experiences.
- Be willing to be a team player working with local, district, and state level professionals to share resources and opportunities.
- Be able to communicate effectively both written and verbally.

The benefits one will receive by becoming a Healthy Living Ambassador include:

- Networking with peers and healthy living leaders around the state and nation.
- Assisting in moving forward the 4-H Healthy Living mission.



BECOME A TEEN SCIENCE CAFÉ FELLOW! Teen Science Cafes are a free, fun way for teens to engage in lively conversations with STEM experts that explore the advances in science and technology that affect their lives. In these events, teens socialize over teen-friendly food and drink and have lively conversations with local scientists and engineers about current cutting-edge developments in their fields, all in a relaxed and informal out-of-school setting. Teen Science Cafés are for teens, by teens. Teen Science Cafés are not just for the science geeks; they are for all curious teens. Along the way, teen

organizers gain a host of leadership skills. Cafés are typically run about an hour and a half once per month during the school year. A \$2,500 stipend is provided to selected participants to support the implementation of Teen Science Cafes. Click here for more information and to apply.



STEM FLIGHTS: STEM Flights is a national nonprofit organization that combines STEM education with a free flight experience for middle and high school students. They pair students with Pilot Mentors in their geographic area to receive a flight experience, learn about aviation and STEM careers, and connect with local aviation enthusiasts. Students complete the STEM Flights application, study online aviation and STEM curriculum, and submit a letter of recommendation before they are matched with a pilot. Student applications are accepted year-round and in all 50 states. If you know a 6th-12th grade student who is

# WHAT CAN AND CANNOT BE COMPOSTED

#### Can be composted:

- Coffee grounds and filters
- Fruits and vegetables
- Egg shells
- Tea bags with staples removed
- Yard trimmings, leaves, grass clippings
- Paper and cardboard
- Nutshells

#### Should not be composted:

- Fat, grease, oil, lard
- Dairy products
- Eggs
- Diseased plants
- Meats, fish, bones
- Pet waste, cat litter
- Plant trimmings with pesticides

# Composting at Home

Every gardener knows about the soil improvement benefits of either store-bought or compost that is produced at home. Even if you are not a gardener, you can save your plant-based trimmings and organic waste from your kitchen, your houseplants, some pet bedding, and other indoor and outdoor sources to compost at home or give to compostable recycling centers that are increasingly being offered in urban areas like Alexandria VA and Arlington County VA. Regularly adding compost to soil will benefit the soil and us in a number of ways.

- Composting helps to recycle plant material and return nutrients to the garden or landscape that might otherwise be sent to landfills.
- The soil's structure will improve because compost contains substances that encourage aggregation. If you have sandy soil, compost will increase its water holding capacity. If you have clay soils, adding compost will help the soil drain better, and will make water and nutrients more easily available to plants.
- Compost increases nutrient holding capability (i.e., cation exchange capacity) and the buffering capacity of the soil. This prevents rapid leaching of lime and nutrients and ameliorates the detrimental effects of over liming and overfertilizing.
- Compost can help make garden soil ready to use earlier in the season.
- By helping to make soil more porous, compost reduces soil erosion because it promotes water infiltration into soil and decreases the bulk density of the soil, making it easier for roots to penetrate the soil.
- Compost provides food and habitat for earthworms, soil insects, and microorganisms like mycorrhizal fungi that help make nutrients more available to plants.
- Compost contains decaying plant and animal refuse that provide trace elements as well as humic and other organic acids that provide needed nutrients to plant growth and can reduce plant drought stress.
- Compost promotes healthy plants that are less susceptible to diseases and insect pests, reducing the need for pesticides.

#### Peach slices


- Mint leaves

## **Exercise Safety in the Heat**

As you strive to achieve the recommended 150 minutes of physical activity a day, it's a good to get outside in new surroundings and fresh air.

During the summer months, however, it can be hot. Follow these steps to keep safe:

- Avoid the hottest parts of the day. Workout before 10am and after dusk.
- 2. Apply sunscreen, even on cloudy days. Re-apply every two hours.
- 3. Stay hydrated. Drink plenty of water before and after exercise.
- 4. Wear loose-fitting clothing to insure air circulation. Light-colored clothing reflects the sun's rays to keep you cool.
- 5. Pay attention to how you feel! If you feel dizzy, faint or nauseous. Find shade, sit down, and drink water until you feel better.
