4-H PROJECTS & PORTFOLIOS A creative method for youth to document their experiences

Prince William 4-H'ers document their experiences and work each year by using age-appropriate 4-H Project Record Forms. These records are submitted to Prince William 4-H for review and are eligible to compete at the Prince William County Fair and county and state 4-H competitions. Projects begin October 1st and 4-H Project Records are due by the following September 30th. 4-H'ers may choose to submit a record of an individual project (Project Record) or their entire life history (Portfolio).

Ultimately, your 4-H Project Records will form an excellent summary of your 4-H career. You will use information in the 4-H records to complete 4-H resumés, Virginia 4-H All Star forms and in making application for jobs, scholarships and honors. Your 4-H Portfolio may become a personal scrapbook which will be cherished for many years.

STEPS FOR A 4-H PROJECT

- 1. Select at least one annual project based on interests.
- 2. Complete at least 6 learning experiences/ activities (typically found in published 4-H project books).
- 3. Record and analyze your learning experience by tracing your progress and emphasizing life skills gained by using the 4-H Project Record form.
- 4. Submit the completed Project Record to Prince William 4-H for review and scoring against a rubric to see how much you've grown!

WHAT IS A 4-H PORTFOLIO?

Portfolios are a record of the life achievement of a 4-H'er. They create a record of accomplishments which can be very helpful when youth are applying for college and scholarship opportunities. They may include material not directly related to 4-H and should be organized by year. Portfolios consist of multiple years of work (except for first time submissions).

Some projects, such as animal projects, shooting education, and archery, have specialized 4-H Project Books that must be completed and submitted prior to participating in 4-H contests for those activities in order to establish basic knowledge, level of experience, and safety.

PRINCE WILLIAM 4-H COMPETITIONS

Through Prince William 4-H, youth are provided opportunities to develop their unique talents and capabilities. In 4-H, we "Learning by Doing." 4-H provides opportunities for both training (learning) and practice (doing). Through competitions, 4'H'ers develop life skills that are relevant now and in the future. Youth who develop life skills become self-directed, productive, contributing citizens.



LEARNING COMPETITIONS

4-H programming with youth is guided by an experiential learning process that includes goal setting, cognition, practice, and performance. The performance stage is when members demonstrate what they have learned through various 4-H activities and events, including competitions. Youth are scored against a published rubric. competition experiences enhance positive youth development and prepare youth with positive competitive knowledge, skills, attitudes, and aspirations that can lead to success through life.

SHARE THE FUN & PRESENTATIONS

Share-the-Fun and Presentation Day are our most popular competitions and encourage 4-H'ers to display their talents in expressive arts and develop presentation skills and confidence performing in front of an audience. Judges evaluate 4-H performers based on talent, audience response, creativity, showmanship, and use of costumes/props. The goal is to help participants develop their talents in a creative and constructive manner, develop research and writing skills, learn computer skills, and improve communication skills. Competition categories include: presentations, extemporaneous speech, public speech, drama, dramatic reading, table setting, fashion review, science fair, radio and public address, and vocal-instrumental-combo performance.



PROJECT RECORDS & PORTFOLIOS

4-H Project Records form an excellent summary of a 4-H'ers career. Youth will use information in the 4-H records to complete 4-H resumés, Virginia 4-H All Star forms and in making application for jobs, scholarships and honors. 4-H Portfolios combine all 4-H experiences over the lifetime of the member. Both Project Records and portfolios are submitted annually to Prince William 4-H for scoring. Special interest clubs, such as horse and shooting education, require project records and portfolios prior to competing.

A variety of 4-H competitions and events are available for youth to practice and perfect the life skills they learn through their projects.

DOING COMPETITIONS

Team competitions provide opportunities for youth to develop the interpersonal, leadership and cooperative skills necessary to be successful in our interdependent and global society. Teams and individuals may progress from local to district, state, and national competitions.

4-H Food Challenge: 4-H teams learn kitchen and cooking safety, how to prepare nutritious meals and snacks, and key concepts of healthy living. Learning experiences focus on nutrition, food purchasing, food preparation, food safety, and related careers.

4-H Shooting Education & Sports: This program uses shooting as a vehicle to teach youth life skills such as responsibility, self discipline, and teamwork. Firearm Safety and marksmanship are also taught using the disciplines of shotgun, skeet/trap, air pistol, air rifle, BB, small bore, muzzleloader, and archery.

4-H Horse Competitions: Virginia's 4-H horse program emphasizes project based learning about equine selection, nutrition, management, riding, recreation, fun, competition, horsemanship, and sportsmanship. Competitions focus on hippology and horsemanship.

4-H Livestock Competitions: This animal science project enables youth to develop their interests in beef cattle, sheep, meat goats and swine. 4-H'ers learn about selection, care and feeding of livestock, animal health, and the importance of good record keeping. Competitions are available in livestock judging and stockmen's contests, and livestock shows.

RINCE WILLIAM COUNTY FAIR

Share your 4-H experiences and growth with the county! The PWC Fair is held every August and youth have opportunities to submit their work and demonstrate their knowledge in everything 4-H! Most youth competitions are free to enter and are great portfolio building experiences.



- Prince William 4-H Camp Counselor/Counselor in Training: as a camp
 counselor, you are a caring leader. You have concern for others, develop
 empathy and the ability to nurture relationships. You understand the
 importance of sharing to give everyone an opportunity to thrive.
- Prince William 4-H Association Leadership: In a leadership role within the Prince William 4-H Association, you learn to work in a team of youth and adults, are self motivated, and learn marketable business skills such as communicating, negotiating, computer office programs, accounting, and marketing.
- Prince William 4-H Club Leadership: In a club leadership role, you become an experienced manager. You set goals, plan and organize, budget resources, and keep records. You learn resiliency and how to rework or overcome obstacles.
- Service Learning Projects & Community Service: As a community service
 volunteer, you learn the value of giving by contributing to a group effort, the
 importance of responsible citizenship, and develop leadership skills.
- 4-H Projects: 4-H Projects develop key thinking skills such as service learning, critical thinking, problem solving and decision making. You learn how to learn by exploring interests through project work.

Earn Awards & Honors

- National 4-H & Virginia 4-H Ambassador for Citizenship, Healthy Living, STEM and Agriculture, Virginia 4-H Ambassadors, Horse Ambassadors, and Shooting Sports Ambassadors: As an elected representative of 4-H, your job is to relate to youth and encourage them to thrive in 4-H. You are an effective communicator, work in cooperation within the youth and adult network of 4-H, develop strong social skills, become savvy at conflict resolution, and learn to accept differences.
- Virginia 4-H All Stars: When nominated into Virginia 4-H All Stars, you
 represent the best in 4-H. You grow in self esteem, responsibility, and
 character. Through self discipline, you have thrived in 4-H and are ready to be
 an engaged community leader.

Developed by 4-H educators from Cornell University, The University of Illinois, West Virginia University and Utah State University, Power Protectors teaches kids about the exciting world of renewable energy, how to address real-world issues and explore careers in energy.



POWER PROTECTORS STEM CHALLENGE KIT

The kit, perfect for individuals aged 8-14, includes three activities that are highly adaptable for afterschool programs, 4-H clubs, classrooms, home use and more.

- **Superhero Hideout:** Youth will be introduced to renewable energy concepts analyze and assess their own energy use, and design an electrifying Power Protector hideout.
- Amped Up Engineering: Youth will beable to explain the differences between renewable and non-renewable energy sources, and use the Engineering Design Process to create, build, test and improve a model of solar, wind or hydropower source.
- Energy Island Adventure: Youth will be able to describe three types of sustainable energy, address problems and create solutions, and collaborate and strategize to help Energy Island use renewable energy sources such as sun, wind and water.
