
4-H Clubs are open to youth ages 5-19. They can be established in-school, after school, or as independent clubs, and can be teacher or volunteer led.

During the weekend of September 9-10, Trigger Time participated in the VA State Shoot. The State Shoot is held at Holiday Lake 4-H Center, Appomattox, VA. The team had two days of competing in their disciplines and Trigger Time had two members apply to be Shooting Education Ambassadors.

It was a busy weekend with rain and storms but Trigger Time did great in all their disciplines. We started the first day with a safety brief that all had to attend.

- For 22 Pistol Silhouettes, Noble Richter placed 2nd.
- For 3P Air Rifle, Lexi Strand placed 2nd and Samantha Erick placed 3rd. Trigger Time's Senior team placed 1st and consisted of Lexi Strand, Samantha Erick, and Noah Richter. Trigger Time's Junior team placed 4th and consisted of Rebecca Ahrens, Jubilee Richter, and Ayden Strand.
- For Air Rifle silhouettes, Noah Richter placed 1st, Lexi Strand placed 2nd, and Samantha Erick placed 4th.
- For BB, Rebecca Ahrens placed 4th.
- For Smallbore, Sam Seagle placed 1st and was also awarded the Paul Beneche award for the second year in a row, and Lexi Strand placed 3rd. Trigger Time's Senior Team placed 1st and consisted of Sam Seagle, Lexi Strand, and Samantha Erick. Trigger Time's Junior Team placed 8th and consisted of Rebecca Ahrens, Jubilee Richter, and Ayden Strand.
- In Muzzleloader, Sam Seagle placed 3rd with a score of 90. The Senior Muzzleloader team placed 2nd and consisted of Sam Seagle, Lexi Strand and William McPherson.
- For Basic Supported Air Pistol, Kira Lorentz placed 2nd and for International Standing Air Pistol, Noble Richter placed 2nd, and Samantha Erick placed 3rd. Trigger Time's Senior Team placed 1st and consisted of Noble Richter, Samantha Erick, and Noah Richter. Trigger Time's Junior Team placed 4th and consisted of Rebecca Ahrens, Verity Teasley, and Ayden Strand.
- For Skeet, Jonathan Farr placed 2nd and Ben Stewart placed 4th. The Senior Team placed 6th and consisted of Ben Stewart, Koa Mintz, Chris Nevarr, and Mason Norris and the Junior Team placed 9th and consisted of Jonathan Farr and Valor Richter.
- For Trap, Kira Lorentz placed 1st and shot her first 25 out of 25. The Senior Team placed 3rd and consisted of Ben Stewart, Koa Mintz, Chris Nevarr, and Mason Norris.
- Some of the Trigger Time members participated in the Target Sprint. This is where Junior
 participants run a lap and then shoot five shots three times. Senior members run two laps and
 then shoot five shots three times. Noble Richter placed 1st and Noah Richter placed 2nd for
 the Senior Boys. Samantha Erick placed 1st and Sam Seagle placed 2nd for the Senior Girls.
 Rebecca Ahrens placed 1st for Junior Girls.
- Samantha Erick and Lexi Strand both applied for the VA 4-H Shooting Education Ambassador Program. They had to fill out an application, get recommendation letters, and write a resume before the State Shoot. During the weekend they were interviewed by a panel of 4-H Shooting Education Leaders and current 4-H Ambassadors. They were both accepted into the program and were put to work as soon as they completed their disciplines for the day.

We had a fun weekend and everyone did a great job in their disciplines and representing Trigger Time. Thank you to the coaches, volunteers and parents that made the weekend possible.

Opportunities for High School Students at VA Soil & Water Conservation District



ENVIROTHON is a team-based natural resources competition for high school students. Students who participate learn stewardship and management concepts and work to solve real-world environmental problems. The program is field-oriented, community-based, and gives students an opportunity to work with natural resource professionals. Students work in teams of five. Throughout the school year students prepare to compete at the local level, qualify to then compete at the area level and the top three teams from the six Soil & Water Conservation District areas in the state compete to be the State Winner. These teams of high school students are tested on their knowledge of natural resources-soils, forestry, wildlife, aquatics and a current environmental issue. Students visit five "in-the-field" test stations where written and hands-on problem solving is required along with an oral presentation formulating a strategy to address a specific environmental issue they've been presented with. The event is competitive but education is the bottom line.

Teams can be created through school clubs, classes, 4-H groups, home school groups, and nature centers. The only requirement is that the team has a minimum of five students (who are in 9th-12th grade) and one adult advisor/chaperone.



YOUTH CONSERVATION LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE (YCLI) is a recognition program for students in 9th- 12th grade that focuses on volunteer service and environmental stewardship. YCLI offers self-motivated and enthusiastic high school students interested in environmental conservation and stewardship an opportunity to build leadership skills and connect with local mentors involved with

Students in 9th-12th grade may apply to be a part of this program. Program participants are required to complete a minimum of 20 hours of community service with a conservation focus as well as participate in a book discussion and submit required progress reports throughout the year. The hours may be done as part of a single project or a series of projects but all projects must be approved by the YCLI Program Coordinator. YCLI participants work with the YCLI Program Coordinator to come up with a

project that the YCLI Participant wants to focus on. Participants must be self-driven individuals able to set their own goals, evaluate their set milestones, and be motivated to move their projects forward. The YCLI Participants are paired with a mentor to help them with their project. Mentors can be Soil & Water Conservation Staff.


