SPRING AIR 2024

March 16-17, 2024. Trigger Time 4-H Club competed in the 2024 Spring Air. The competition was held at Skelton 4-H Educational Center in Wirtz, VA. Our team members traveled 4 hours to compete and some stayed the weekend. We had a lot of first-time members and a total of 27 compete.

Trigger Time had a member representative in each discipline. We had five participate in Public Speaking. Samantha Erick placed 3rd with her emotional speech about The 4-H Pledge, Sam Seagle tied 4th with a speech that compared the Stock Market to Shooting Sports, and Juila Wallschlaeger also 4th with a speech about NRA Safety. Ayden Strand placed 6th with his speech about Shooting Sports and Life Skills and Lexi Strand placed 8th with a speech about Importance of Shooting Education Programs.

Becca Isaacson competed in Compound Archery and received a score of 174.

In the Recurve discipline Trigger Time has 6 of the top 8 places. Noah Richter placed 1st with a score of 276, Kira Lorentz placed 2nd with a score of 275 and Zaynab Mason placed 3rd with a score of 272. Becca Isaacson placed 6th, Noble Richter placed 7th and Leia Roetta placed 8th.

Samantha Holmes placed 6th in the Genesis discipline.

Now on to BB! The BB participants shoot a match and took a BB test. We had the 2nd place team, and the members were Rebecca Ahrens who scored a 464, Noble Richter with a 440, Tanner Ridings with a 424, Ayden Strand 422, Jubilee Richter with a 420, Valor Richter with a 422, Sophie Carter 414, Lee Carter 400, Xanthie Mintz with a 366, Stella Carter with a 367 and Aisling Mintz with a 347. Rebecca Ahrens placed 4th individually and received a 98 on the BB test!

Kira Lorentz placed 5th in the Air Pistol Silhouette with a score of 12.

In the Air Rifle Silhouettes, Sam Seagle placed 1st with a score of 18 (5 rams), Noah Richter placed 3rd with a score of 18 (4 rams), Samantha Erick placed 5th with a score of 17 and Jubilee Richter placed 6th with a score of 16.

In Air Pistol - Basic Supported, Valor Richter placed 12th with a score of 328.

Air Pistol - International Standing, Noble Richter placed 2nd with a score of 333, Samantha Erick placed 4th with a score of 326 and Noah Richter placed 5th with a score of 312. Placing in the top 8 put them in Air Pistol Finals where Samantha Erick placed 3rd , Noah and Noble Richter placed 6th.

We had three Air Pistol teams:

- ★ Mixed team with Valor Richter 328, Ayden Strand 276 and Tanner Ridings 267, place 3rd.
- ★ International Standing team with Noble Richter 259, Samantha Erick 320 and Noah Richter 312 placed 1st.
- ★ International Standing team with Julia Wallschlaeger 259, Leia Roetto 197, Kira Lorentz 169 placed 2nd.

In the Air Rifle discipline, we had 5 members place in the top 8. They participated in the Air Rifle Finals and Sam Seagle placed 2nd with a score of 621, Samantha Erick placed 3 with a score of 615, Rebecca Ahrens placed 4th with a score of 602, Lexi Strand 5th with a score of 589 and Noah Richter placed 8th with a score of 502.

We had three Air Rifle Teams:

- ★ Team A which placed 1st with a combined score of 2106, team members were Sam Seagle 534, Samantha Erick 537, Rebecca Ahrens 522 and Lexi Strand 513.
- ★ Team B which placed 3rd with a combined score of 1857, team members were Noah Richter 502, Ayden Strand 472, Jubilee Richter 444 and Tanner Ridings 439.
- ★ Team C which placed 7th with a combined score of 1665, team members were Juila Wallschlaeger442, William McPherson 411, Tonchi Mintz 411 and Koa Mintz 401.

From the milk you drink for breakfast to the ingredients that cows consume on a daily basis to produce the milk in your glass, nutrition is a huge part of the dairy industry. Here are some interactive nutrition activities you can share with your 4-H Club or students this month:

- What Do Cows Eat to Stay Healthy? Click here to watch a short animated video to discover what dairy cows eat every day as part of a well-balanced diet. Dairy farmers work with nutritionists to develop special diets for cows to make sure they get the nutrients they need. See what goes into a cow's total mixed ration (TMR) — you may be surprised by some of the ingredients!

The Virginia Department of Forestry, in cooperation with other natural resource conservation agencies and organizations, has proudly administered Camp Woods and Wildlife (formerly called Holiday Lake Forestry Camp) for more than 70 years. Camp Woods and Wildlife is an academic, structured, residential camp that focuses on field experiences in forestry and other natural resources. This unique camping experience introduces 13-16-year-olds to the challenges, special skills, and knowledge needed for managing the forest resources we use and enjoy every day.

Camp Woods and Wildlife is ideal for students who:

- wish to explore forestry and wildlife related careers
- * participate in forestry and wildlife judging teams, Envirothon competitions, or ecology clubs
- * want to experience hands-on learning and gain real-world skills in natural resources conservation
- *

Camp Activities

- * Classes are taught mainly outdoors, by natural resource professionals.
- * Courses include: Sustainable Forest Management, Forest Ecology, Mapping, Environmental Protection, Forest Health, Wildlife Management, Tree Identification
- * Other learning experiences include urban forestry and forest products demonstrations; exploratory classes in topics such as forest fire equipment and tactics, wilderness survival, canoeing, and archery; and presentations by conservation police officers, wildlife researchers, and other natural resource professionals.
- * Campers participate in a Lumberjack Field Day with group competition in crosscut sawing, log rolling, and other traditional outdoor skills contests.
- * Recreation and athletics include swimming and volleyball.

Virginia 4-H STEM Summer Camps at Virginia Tech

Virginia Tech Fralin Life Sciences Institute on Virginia Tech's Blacksburg Campus, in collaboration with 4-H, is running six weeklong, half-day STEM Summer Camps. Camps will run Monday - Friday from 9 am - 12 pm, and are appropriate for kids ages 9-12. The camp is offered six times during the summer on the following dates (participants may only attend one week) and is limited to 16 campers per week.

May 28 - 31 June 3 - 7 July 8 - 12 July 15 - 19 July 29 - August 2 August 5 - 9

Each day we will focus on different STEM topics including Geology (including jewelry making), Horticulture (tour of the Hahn Horticulture Garden) and Engineering (design build activities). Since a majority of our time will be in a lab setting the child must wear long pants (or skirt to the ankle, if appropriate) and close toed shoes. We will also be moving around campus so please make sure your shoes are comfortable and plan on being on your feet the entire time.

Snacks will not be provided however we will take a 15 min break around 10:30 am so that students can eat a quick snack outside and use the restroom. We encourage kids to bring a water bottle.


