<u>aging/bluebird-tours</u>. It is your responsibility to make yourself aware of important information concerning your Bluebird experience.

Payment Policy

A reservation must be confirmed immediately with a check, money order, or credit card. in the amount of \$5 for a one-day tour and \$10 for an overnight tour to hold your space. Balance will be charged for one-day trips two weeks prior to the trip and for over night trips, 30 days prior to trip. When making a payment, request a receipt by providing an active email address. Quality Tours requires deposits for certain trips at the time of booking and is noted in that trip's description. The deposit would be refundable if the trip does not run.

Refunds and Cancellations

There is a **"No Refund"** policy in place unless and If, when you cancel there is a standby list and from it, we can find a replacement. If you need to cancel your reservation, please call Quality Tours and speak to one of our agents handling the Bluebird Tour Program. All cancellations are subject to an administration fee of \$5.00 for one-day trips and \$10.00 for overnight trips. <u>A</u> <u>refund will only be given if there is someone on the</u> <u>"standby list" to take your space.</u> Trip cancellation insurance is available only for overnight tours and it is highly suggested.

Schedule and Trip Information

Guidelines for Tipping

The suggested gratuity for a driver is \$3-\$4 per day. The gratuity for sightseeing guides is included in cost of tour. A docent is usually not tipped for their service. If a meal is included in a tour, all taxes and gratuities have already

been included in the tour cost (excluding alcoholic beverages). Tour Escorts do not expect tips, but do appreciate them.

<u>Trip Insurance</u>

TRIP CANCELLATION INSURANCE IS AVAILABLE ONLY ON OVERNIGHT TOURS AND IS NOT INCLUDED in the price of the overnight trips. Insurance is available to everyone through <u>Travelguard.com</u> Rates are based on the cost of the tour and your age. The insurance provides trip cancellation coverage, trip interruption coverage, baggage up to \$500, emergency accident/sickness medical expenses up to \$2,500, and emergency fees. Seating Policy for One Day Trips

Passengers boarding in Manassas sit on the Driver's side of the bus. Passengers boarding in Woodbridge sit on the Door side of the bus.

Departure Points

Plan to arrive at least **15 minutes before trip** departure time.

One Day Tours

Manassas at Wal-Mart located at 9401 Liberia Avenue. We load in the parking lot on your right close to WaWa. No parking overnight.

Woodbridge at Featherstone Shopping Center located at 14527 Richmond Highway. We load in the rear of McDonald's. No parking overnight.

Overnight Tours

Manassas at the public parking lot next door to the Manassas Sr. Center located at 9320 Mosby Street, Manassas, VA 20110.

Woodbridge at the A. J. Ferlazzo Building located at 15941 Donald Curtis Drive, Woodbridge, VA 22191. For this pickup point you will receive a parking permit in with your baggage tags and itinerary.

Return Times

The bus driver and/or escort will make the decision as to which location will be dropped off first. It will be based on factors that affect driving.

Note: All return times are approximate. The driver will provide a more exact time on the trip return day.

Overnight trips will require thirty participants. Note: At reservation the time special of any accommodations, including but not limited to seating and dietary restrictions, should be mentioned.

Note: Two weeks after the new brochure has been distributed any remaining space will be opened to residents over 18 years of age and individuals or groups from Prince William County or surrounding counties. Installment payments may be arranged for any tour with the reservationist at time of booking. Wednesday, May 8 DOGWOODS & PATRIOT'S ADVENTURE Valley Forge, PA Cost: \$122 pp

A tour in Valley Forge National Park offers not just the chance to walk in the footsteps of some of the most important figures in American history and also fantastic scenery hopefully with the Dogwood trees in full bloom. Our first stop is at the information center to meet our guide and then proceed on a journey into history! Our guide will take us on the 10-mile driving loop of Valley Forge Park, providing interpretation of the 6-month winter Washington's army endured from 1777-1778 as well as the evolution of what was farmland and industry into a National Park. We will see all points of interest in the Park including the National Memorial Arch and Washington's Headquarters as well as Muhlenberg's Brigade which was the site where several regiments from predominantly Virginia stayed during the Valley Forge Encampment. Explore several reconstructed soldiers' huts built to Washington's specifications and learn about what life was like for members of the Army on the ground level. At Washington's Head-guarters visit the original building George and Martha Washington, Alexander Hamilton, and the rest of Washington's "military family" stayed during the Valley Forge Winter Encampment. We will also visit the Grand Parade Ground where Baron Friedrich von Steuben began retraining Washington's troops and formed the foundation of the United States' Army. We also have a great **buffet lunch** planned at the Black Powder Tavern. Following lunch, we will depart for home. We will depart Manassas at 5:45 a.m. and Woodbridge at 6:30 a.m. Return time is approximately 6:30 p.m.

Saturday, May 11 Fulton Theatre presents: SOUTH PACIFIC Lancaster, PA Cost: \$160 pp

Tuesday - Fríday, May 14th - 17th ROCHESTER LILAC FESTIVAL Rochester, NY Cost: \$1161 Single & \$871 Twin pp

Back in 1890, Rochester's finest horticulturalists planted several thousand flowering shrubs on the south slope of Highland Park. Imagine their delight on a sunny Sunday in May 1898 when a spontaneous festival broke out in the park! More than 3,000 people flocked to see the magnificent display of blooms, especially the bright purples, whites, and pinks of the park's first lilac gardens. Now 134 years later, with its star status of presenting the largest lilac collection in the Unites States, a visit to Highland Park offers a rare opportunity to experience the incredible beauty and intense fragrance of more than 500 varieties of lilacs on 1800 plants. Tour includes 3 breakfasts, 2 lunches and 3 dinners. We will depart Manassas at 6:15 a.m. and Woodbridge at 7:00 a.m. Return time is approximately 5:00 p.m.

The Itinerary

<u>Day One:</u>

Today you depart on your deluxe motorcoach for a scenic ride to Rochester, NY, where you have accommodations at the **Holiday Inn Express** for the next three nights. This evening we will enjoy dinner at the **Golden Corral**.

Day Two:

This morning after a full breakfast at your hotel, you take a 2.5-mile drive to nearby Highland Park, where you have four hours to enjoy the Lilac Festival. Here you will find over 1800 lilac bushes with over 450 varieties of this beautiful, fragrant spring flower, including rare yellow lilacs. There are also many types of lovely flowers in the park with many types of pansies, tulips and trees. However, the queen of the show is the huge collection of lilacs. There is a lot of free music with local bands and choirs and special admission to the indoor Lamberton Conservatory is also included. Within its glass walls are many plants not hearty enough to survive Rochester's temperate climate. Under the main dome of the facility is a tropical floral display. Other climate-controlled rooms contain collections of exotic tropical plants, desert plants, economic plants (such as banana and coffee trees), as well as carnivorous and house plants. Among the most popular attractions at the Conservatory are fauna and seasonal floral displays. Lunch is on your own from one of the many vendors in the park. Why not try a favorite

Rochester dish for lunch – a plate of macaroni salad with your choice of 2 hamburgers or 2 hot dogs. For a special treat, get a bag of delicious cinnamon almonds. Have fun! In the afternoon, you tour the city's Susan B. Anthony home. Though she did not live to see women get the right to vote, her efforts were so instrumental in getting the bill passed that the 19th Amendment (passed in 1920) is officially known as the Susan B. Anthony Amendment. **Dinner** tonight is included at **Delmonico's Restaurant** next to your hotel (With reservation advise your choice of Delmonico steak, salmon or chicken marsala). <u>Day Three:</u>

This morning after a full breakfast your hotel, you have admission included at the George Eastman Museum that focuses on the man who founded the Kodak Company. On display is the beautiful Victoria home the Eastman family lived in with many original furnishings. On the property is a wonderful exhibit on the history of Kodak. including a rare "camera obscura", early cameras, and of course Kodak's world-famous Brownie camera, the first camera that was so inexpensive it was affordable to the masses. Next, it's on to Pittsford, just eleven miles away where you are treated to a private cruise just for you and your tour group, on board the Sam Patch, a replica of an 1800s packet boat. During your 1 ¹/₂ hour cruise, you will learn all about the history of the Erie Canal - how "canal locks" work, etc., and of course no cruise on the Erie Canal would be complete without singing "15 Miles on the Erie Canal"! Your cruise guide will lead everyone in the song before docking at Schoen Place, a historic village on the Erie Canal with lots of shops, cafes, and ice cream parlors. A box lunch is included today with an afternoon wine tasting at the beautiful Casa Larga Winery in the nearby village of Fairport. Following dinner, we will enjoy an evening performance of "Cabaret" at the nearby Blackfriars Theatre.

<u>Day Four:</u>

After a full buffet breakfast at your hotel, we will board our bus for our return journey. We will stop for **lunch** at a **Cracker Barrel** en route (\$18 gift card).

Sunday, May 19 THE MEDIA THEATRE presents: LEGALLY BLONDE Wilmington, DE Cost: \$129 pp

Prior to the performance, we will enjoy **lunch** at the **Grand East Buffet** followed by our matinee performance in Wilmington at 3:00 p.m. We will depart Manassas at 8:15 a.m. and Woodbridge at 9:00 a.m. Return time is approximately 8:30 p.m.

Wedwesday, May 22 PENN'S PEAK presents: BILL HALLEY & THE COMETS Jim Thorpe, PA Cost: \$125 pp

Come with us to the beautiful Lehigh Valley and Pocono Mountains to the premier entertainment venue known as **Penn's Peak** that overlooks the beautiful Beltzville Lake. The views alone are worth this trip. We are going to enjoy a great lunch prior to our trip back in time to the late 50's when the entire country began to **Rock Around the Clock** with this group. Return to those teen years of your life and remember the impact this group's music had on each and every one of us. We will depart Manassas at 6:00 a.m. and Woodbridge at 6:45 a.m. Return time is approximately 8:30 p.m.

Fríday-Monday, May 24th - 27th EXPLORE MOONSHINE, MOUNTAINS & MUSIC Breaks, VA & Pikeville, KY Cost: Single \$908 & Twin \$724 pp

It's about time we present a tour that features the beautiful states of Kentucky with Virginia. We will be spending three nights on the Kentucky side in the Breaks Interstate Park while visiting in Pikeville located in eastern Kentucky. It is a small town with a big past. Known as "McCoy territory" from feud lore. Pikeville is the central hub for the region, and a short drive from everything with a wealth of history to be discovered during our visit. We will explore the sites where the Hatfields & McCoys lived, worked and feuded. See bullets that were fired in the feud and other artifacts from feud lore. We will also see the gravesites of the feudists, the Hog Trial Cabin, McCoy Well and much more. We will also **dine in Randolph** McCoy's home in this hands-on heritage experience that you'll never forget. Our lodging for three nights is in Kentucky in the park itself. Tour includes 3 breakfasts, 3 lunches and 3 dinners. We will depart from Woodbridge at 6:15 a.m. and Manassas at 7:00 a.m. Return time is approximately 9:00 p.m.

The Itinerary

Day 1: Friday May 24

You have a day to relax and unwind as we make our way thru Virginia to the Eastern region where the two states of Virginia and Kentucky become neighbors with some of the most beautiful scenery you can imagine. We will be checking in at the Chafin Lodge inside Breaks Interstate Park on the Kentucky side for **three** nights. But first, we will make a stop for our group to have a photo opportunity of "The Grand Canyon of the South" and east of the Mississippi River. After checking in, we will enjoy dinner at the Rhododendron Restaurant. Your dinner choices are meat loaf or flounder with three sides of your choice, full salad bar and dessert and of course, coffee, tea or soda. We will also enjoy the live music of Rachel Messer and Connor Dale. Following our meal and entertainment, we will enjoy the Pauley Hollow Distillery with tasting and the educational components involved.

<u> Day 2 - Saturday May 25</u>

Start the day with breakfast before our departure for an exciting day. We will pick up our guide for a tour of the historic sites including the Hatfield and McCoy historic sites - Hog Trail Site, The historic McCoy Well Site, the Pawpaw Tree site and Aunt Betty's & the Historic Williamson Coal House. The Coal House in Williamson, West Virginia is a unique building built of coal masonry. The bituminous coal was quarried as blocks and dressed as stone using 65 tons of coal from the nearby Winifrede Seam. Located adjacent to the Mingo County Courthouse, it houses the Tug Valley Chamber of Commerce. We will make a lunch stop in South Williamson for a buffet lunch at South Side Steak House. This will be followed by the Dueling Barrels tour. We are going to leave that to your imagination! Returning to our lodging you will have some down time before we depart for our evening adventure. We are headed for our picnic meal in the woods as we scout for Elk. Restored to the area in 2011, they now number over 13,000. Have your camera to catch one of these beautiful animals in their natural setting.

We encourage you to wear long pants, season appropriate clothing in earth colors, and bring your own cameras/binoculars. You are also encouraged to refrain from wearing heavily scented perfumes or body sprays as elk have a very developed sense of smell and may run from strong scents. Imagine joining our experienced guides for a trip into the heart of Virginia's elk restoration zone. In addition, we will witness the full splendor of the spring season in Central Appalachia. Time to return to Breaks Park for a restful night. <u>Day 3 - Sunday May 26</u>

Enjoy breakfast. We will be departing at **8:30 a.m.** Our first stop will be at the **Webb Grocery** then onto **Butcher Hollow**. We will visit the Van Lear Museum where we will enjoy a **Coal Miners Lunch bucket with**

Homemade Beef Veggie soup and salad, Chicken salad and Bologna sandwiches, desert and drinks. This will be followed by a tour of this living museum. While at the Mayo Church tour the organist will play the pump organ donated by Andrew Carnegie. From here, we continue to the Country Music Highway Museum for a visit. Our final visit will be the 1850s Mountain Home Place tour before dinner at the Paintsville Lake Pavilion overlooking the beautiful lake. Enjoy Hot Pulled pork, Pulled chicken, baked beans, Cole slaw, drinks and dessert. Dinner is followed by Live local music at the Pavilion and if rain we will have dinner and entertainment at the auditorium building at the 1850s mountain home place. Return to Breaks Park for our last night. Day 4 - Monday May 27

Enjoy an early breakfast from 6:30 a.m. to 8:00 a.m. We are scheduled to be aboard our coach by 8:00 a.m. Our first stop is the **Big Sandy Museum** where on display are the Hatfield McCoy Relics. The Big Sandy Heritage Museum serves two audiences: Hatfield McCoy Feud enthusiasts, and those who wish to learn more about Pike County/Appalachian culture. While the Hatfield McCoy exhibits are the most popular, the Appalachian culture exhibits, which include exhibits on Daniel Boone, President Garfield, the coal and railroad industry, and the "8th Wonder of the World" Pikeville Cut-Thru, a marvel of man conquers-earth engineering, are also quite popular. The Hatfield McCoy Feud exhibit includes life-size wax mannequins of the two clan leaders, "Devil Anse" Hatfield and Randolph McCoy. These mannequins were custommade in Philadelphia, and include authentic reproductions of the firearms they would have used during the feud era. Framed paintings of the two men by the late Bert Diamond, a Pikeville resident, are another museum display that you won't see anywhere else. Printed articles on the feud are also on display, such as local newspaper cartoons depicting the two clans as hillbillies wallowing with pigs, and as well as other articles that contributed to the sensationalism of the feud.

Next on our agenda is the **Pike County Historic Court House** just next door. Here members of the Hatfield family were tried found guilty of the murders of Tolbert, Randolph, Jr., Pharmer, Alifair, and Calvin McCoy. In September 1889, the bloody results of the feud brought many of the participants into the courthouse in Pikeville. Here, eight members of the Hatfield group were convicted of murder and sentenced to life in prison. These legal proceedings effectively moved the feud from the hills and hollers into the judicial system and newspapers. From here we travel to **the Pikeville Cut-Through Project, an** astonishing engineering wonder that has been called "the eighth wonder of the world" by The New York Times. Its purpose was to relieve the barrage of flooding that the City of Pikeville experienced each year. The Cut-Through Project also provided the City of Pikeville with more room for development, due to the relocation of the Levisa Fork of the Big Sandy River away from downtown Pikeville, and relieved the city of congestion caused by the railroad and the three major highways that passed through it. *Group photo at the Cut.* We will then enjoy *early catered Italian lunch* at **The Pikeville Event Center** featuring baked spaghetti, baked lasagna, salad, bread stick, desert and drinks catered at the event space. By 12:15 p.m. we will depart for home.

Thursday, May 30 LADEW Topiary Gardens & Manor House Monkton, MD Cost: \$90 pp

Named one of "10 incredible topiary gardens around the world," and called "The most outstanding topiary garden in America" and also one of the "Top 5 North American Gardens Worth Traveling For," Ladew Gardens is a must-see. After our **guided walking tour** of the gardens, we will enjoy a catered luncheon in the café. **With your reservation, please advise your choice for lunch from the following: chicken sandwich, chicken salad sandwich, or Berry salad.** Following lunch, we will tour the home. We will depart from Manassas at 7:15 a.m. and Woodbridge at 8:00 a.m. Return time is approximately 4:15 p.m.

JUNE

Saturday, June 1 STEP BACK IN TIME TO STRATFORD HALL & THE LEE FAMILY Westmoreland VA Cost: \$94 pp

Travel with us to the beautiful ancestral home of the Lee family of Virginia. Richard Henry Lee and Henry Lighthorse Lee had the honor to sign the Declaration of Independence for the colony of Virginia. "Lighthorse" Harry Lee was a hero in our War for Independence and his son, Robert E Lee was graduated head of his class at West Point, fought gallantly in the War with Mexico and was the commandant of West Point. Though he served as the General of the Army of Northern Virginia during the War Between the States, he is to this day considered one of the greatest generals our country has ever produced. Following the conflict, he spent the remainder of his life educating those remaining young men of the South at the small Washington College later changed to what is now Wahington & Lee University. Our **late lunch** will be at the **Cracker Barrel** in Fredericksburg **(\$18 gift card)**.
