

Prince William 4-H'ers Lead Community Service Initiative

For our May 4-H service project, my brother Max and I decided on a creek cleanup as we have a strong connection to this type of ecosystem having lived by a wetland our whole lives. We first reached out to the Prince William County Park Authority to coordinate a cleanup event at the Neabsco Creek Boardwalk, a park area that's important to many residents in our area.

Once we got the go-ahead, we sent out details to our 4-H club members, collected signed waivers, gathered trash pick-up tools and bags, and invited our neighbor to join us. On cleanup day, we walked the boardwalk and surrounding stream areas, picking up litter that had accumulated over time.

By the end of the project, we had collected five large bags of trash, including broken car parts, plastic bottles, and snack wrappers. It was a rewarding day—not only did we help restore a special place in our community, but we also felt a strong sense of pride in taking the lead on this effort.

We hope this inspires more youth-led initiatives that make a difference right where we live!

Engaging the 4-H Pillars of Ag, STEM, Citizenship & Healthy Living



Last Friday, youth members of the Virginia 4-H Cabinet and Virginia FFA members joined Governor Glenn Youngkin at McDonald Farms in Blacksburg for the signing of two bills supporting large animal veterinary care in rural Virginia. Governor Glenn Youngkin signed HB 2303 and SB 921, which will establish Virginia's Large Animal Veterinary Grant Program to increase the number of large animal vets in areas of need in Virginia.

As stated by Virginia 4-H, "also in attendance were Virginia Tech College of Agriculture and Life Sciences Dean Mario Ferruzzi and Virginia Cooperative Extension Director Mike Gutter, highlighting the strong partnership between youth, agriculture, and Extension. This legislation is a big step toward

Commonwealth, and a meaningful opportunity for these youth to see governance in action."



Declarations are Open

ALL DECLARATIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY JULY | AT | 1:59 PM.

- ANY Horse or Pony that a youth MAY show at the State Show must be declared in 4HOnline in order to be eligible to show.
- Please be prepared when beginning your declarations with current photos of your animal, Coggins test date, and an accurate height measurement. The correct measurement is imperative, as it is tied to "Animal Type" and linked to specific classes within the entry system. If the height entered is incorrect, it will affect your ability to enter classes. If you notice your height is incorrect, you must re-add that animal as a new animal in order to input the correct measurement, the system will not allow changes.
- If you are declaring a Horse/Pony that you declared last year or in a previous year, you do have the option to re-declare a previously added animal. Please note, if your height/animal type is incorrect due to a previous entry error, you will need to add a new animal and provide all new information. There is no opportunity to change the Animal Type. Additionally, if using an animal from a previous year, please ensure that you upload a CURRENT Coggins Test and edit to reflect the updated Coggins Test date for 2025.

Behind every poppy is a name, a story, a sacrifice.

This year, our community is invited to take part in a quiet act of remembrance by helping create a wall of red paper poppies - each one carrying a handwritten name, message, or note of gratitude.

Memorial Day asks us to remember, but remembrance can take many forms. This shared gesture offers a way to honor those we've lost - not just in ceremony, but in connection. Whether you've experienced the loss of someone who served or simply want to show support, your words are welcome.
