Armed Robbery *SUSPECT IDENTIFIED | ARREST – On May 1, detectives identified and arrested one of the suspects, a **17-year-old male juvenile**, who was sought in connection to the robbery that was reported to have occurred at the Coverstone IV Apartments located in the 7600 block of Croce Ct. in Manassas (20109) on March 30. The investigation continues as detectives attempt to identify the second suspect.

Armed Robbery [Previously Released] –On March 30 at 12:22AM, officers responded to the Coverstone IV Apartments located in the 7600 block of Croce Ct. in Manassas (20109) to investigate a robbery. The investigation revealed the victim, a 21-year-old man, arranged to sell clothing to an unknown buyer via Instagram. Before the transaction was completed, the buyer brandished a firearm and demanded the victim's property. A second unknown man approached and took the victim's property before both suspects left the area. No injuries were reported. Officers and a police K-9 searched the area for the suspects who were not located. Clothing, money, and a firearm were reported missing.

Fatal Crash Investigation – On May 1 at 6:57PM, officers responded to the intersection of Dale Blvd. and Barksdale St. in Woodbridge (22193) to investigate a crash. The investigation revealed the driver of a 2008 Honda Civic was traveling eastbound on Dale Blvd. and the driver of a 2020 Honda Civic was traveling westbound. With a flashing amber traffic signal, the driver of the 2008 Honda initiated a left turn across the westbound lanes of Dale Blvd. towards Barksdale St. and the vehicles collided. The passenger in the 2008 Honda, was extricated from the vehicle and transported to an area hospital where she later died. The driver of the 2008 Honda was treated at an area hospital for non-life threatening injuries. The driver of the 2020 remained at the scene and was not injured. Speed appears to be a factor for the 2020 Honda. **Crash investigators are asking anyone who may have witnessed this crash to contact police.**

Commercial Burglaries – On May 1 at 7:57AM, officers responded to 2680 Opitz Blvd. in Woodbridge (22192) to investigate an alarm activation. When officers arrived in the area, they observed two nearby businesses that had been burglarized. The investigation revealed at around 2:00AM, two unknown individuals smashed the front glass doors of both Poke Mian and Wayback Burger to gain entry into the businesses. An undisclosed amount of money was reported missing. While investigating the above burglaries, officers observed the front glass door smashed at Delcampo Restaurant located nearby at 2780 Metro Plz. An undisclosed amount of money was reported missing. Detectives are actively investigating the burglaries to determine if these incidents are related. There is no suspect description at this time.

Vandalism on School Grounds – On May 1 at 11:51AM, a School Resource Officer responded to Gainesville High School located at 13150 University Blvd. in Gainesville (20155) was notified of vandalism in the bathroom. The investigation revealed derogatory language was etched into a bathroom stall wall. The etchings were recently observed and reported to school personnel. The etching did not appear to contain any direct threats toward students or staff. No additional markings were reported.

Suspicious Incident – On April 30 at 11:01AM, the School Resource Officer (SRO) assigned to Patriot High School located at 10504 Kettle Run Rd. in Nokesville (20181) was notified of an inappropriate drawing in a classroom. The investigation revealed on April 29, a student observed a swastika was drawn on the whiteboard inside of a classroom and reported it to school personnel. The SRO and school personnel determined the observed drawing did not appear to contain any threats of harm towards students, staff, or other school personnel. No additional drawings were located.
