You'll use age-appropriate Project Record Forms and follow the 4-H Portfolio rubric to make sure everything's in tip-top shape.

Who Needs to Submit?

- All Prince William 4-H'ers should submit individual project records or a full portfolio.
- Club Officers and Association Officers must turn in an Officer Project Record Form to get credit for their year of service.
- Dreaming of becoming a Virginia 4-H Ambassador or joining the Virginia 4-H All Stars? You'll need portfolios from several years so start now!

Need Help? Don't worry - Prince William 4-H has your back! Join the Portfolio Support Office Hours from Monday, September 8th to Friday, September 12th, 10 AM to 5 PM. Whether you need help organizing, supplies like binders and scrapbook paper, or just have questions, stop by, call, or email.







Prince William 4-H'ers document their experiences and work each year by using age-appropriate 4-H Project Record Forms. These records are submitted to Prince William 4-H for review and are eligible to compete at the Prince William County Fair and county and state 4-H competitions. Projects begin October 1st and 4-H Project Records are due by the following September 30th. 4-H'ers may choose to submit a record of an individual project (Project Record) or their entire life history (Portfolio).

Ultimately, your 4-H Project Records will form an excellent summary of your 4-H career. You will use information in the 4-H records to complete 4-H resumés, Virginia 4-H All Star forms and in making application for jobs, scholarships and honors. Your 4-H Portfolio may become a personal scrapbook which will be cherished for many years.

STEPS FOR A 4-H PROJECT

- 1. Select at least one annual project based on interests.
- 2. Complete at least 6 learning experiences/ activities (typically found in published 4-H project books).
- 3. Record and analyze your learning experience by tracing your progress and emphasizing life skills gained by using the 4-H Project Record form.
- 4. Submit the completed Project Record to Prince William 4-H for review and scoring against a rubric to see how much you've grown!

WHAT IS A 4-H PORTFOLIO?

Portfolios are a record of the life achievement of a 4-H'er. They create a record of accomplishments which can be very helpful when youth are applying for college and scholarship opportunities. They may include material not directly related to 4-H and should be organized by year. Portfolios consist of multiple years of work (except for first time submissions).

Some projects, such as animal projects, shooting education, and archery, have specialized 4-H Project Books that must be completed and submitted prior to participating in 4-H contests for those activities in order to establish basic knowledge, level of experience, and safety.





Small farm record keeping can include everything from tax preparation and financial tracking to daily harvest logs and breeding schedules. A clean and organized paper trail is essential not only for your tax professional, but also for managing the day-to-day flow of your farm operations. In this webinar you will learn how to:
