1. Summary of Activities Since Last Report:

Over the past month, I have had the opportunity to meet with three of our County Supervisors to share my vision for the future of the Arts Council. Additional meetings are scheduled throughout the remainder of the month, ensuring that each Supervisor is fully engaged and informed about our work, our goals, and the role the Arts Council plays in enhancing the cultural vibrancy of Prince William County.
