#### PW 4-H Club Reporters - It's Time to Send in Your Monthly Reports



**Hey Prince William 4-H Clubs** — **it's that time again!** Your monthly club reports are due each month. We've set up a schedule to help with newsletter space and to provide due dates - so don't forget to send yours in to PW 4-H Headquarters!

**WAIT... WHAT REPORTS?** 

Yep, you heard right! Every club has officers - and one of them (usually the Club Reporter) needs to send a quick email with:

- A short summary of what your club did this month (think: cool projects, community service, awards, shoutouts, etc.)
- I to 6 photos with captions showing off your club in action!

#### **BUT WHY THOUGH?**

Because your club is awesome - and people should know about it! These reports:

- Help track your club's journey all year long
- Keep parents and the community in the loop
- Show off your skills and teamwork
- Might even help bring in new members or support!

Plus, if you're the 4-H Club Reporter, you're building real-world skills like writing, time management, and leadership!

#### **HOW TO DO IT:**

On the 1st of each month, write up a short recap (even just a few sentences is fine!). Include:

- What your club did
- Any shoutouts or thank-yous to community supporters
- Up to 6 photos with captions
- Then sign your name, officer role (like "Club Reporter"), and your club name.
