Four educational workshops, five market days, and an exciting summer of strategizing and growing our businesses with friends and mentors...an opportunity that will forever change us! During Thursday's debrief session, the young entrepreneurs turned in their completed 4-H Project Records. We reflected on the overall experience and discussed several key areas:

• What went well: Participants highlighted positive aspects of the program, including successful product development, teamwork, and improved communication skills.

- Challenges: We explored areas that didn't go as smoothly, such as time management, unexpected expenses, and marketing difficulties.
- **Goal Achievement:** Each participant evaluated whether they met their personal and business goals set at the beginning of the program.
- **Budget Review:** The group reviewed their budgets to determine whether they stayed within limits or went over.
- Improvements for Next Year: The Young Entrepreneurs shared thoughtful suggestions for how the program could be improved next year.

Hey Prince William 4-H Clubs — it's that time again! Your monthly club reports are due each month. We've set up a schedule to help with newsletter space and to provide due dates - so don't forget to send yours in to PW 4-H Headquarters!

WAIT... WHAT REPORTS? Yep, you heard right! Every club has officers - and one of them (usually the Club Reporter) needs to send a quick email with:

- A short summary of what your club did this month (think: cool projects, community service, awards, shoutouts, etc.)
- I to 6 photos with captions showing off your club in action!

BUT WHY THOUGH?

Because your club is awesome - and people should know about it! These reports:

- Help track your club's journey all year long
- Keep parents and the community in the loop
- Show off your skills and teamwork
- Might even help bring in new members or support!

Plus, if you're the 4-H Club Reporter, you're building real-world skills like writing, time management, and leadership!

HOW TO DO IT:

On the 1st of each month, write up a short recap (even just a few sentences is fine!). Include:

- What your club did
- Any shoutouts or thank-yous to community supporters
- Up to 6 photos with captions
- Then sign your name, officer role (like "Club Reporter"), and your club name.

Put Into Action: The 4-H Pillar of Citizenship



What does it mean to be a good citizen? For 4-H youth in Prince William County, it means stepping up, speaking out, and showing up for your community - and that's exactly what happened on October 7th, when the Prince William County Board of Supervisors officially proclaimed National 4-H Week (October 5–II, 2025)! Two of our very own youth leaders, **Michael and Jacklyn**, represented Prince William 4-H at the proclamation ceremony. They didn't just stand in front of county officials - they spoke up about how 4-H has helped them grow as leaders, learners, and active citizens. Their voices were heard, and their message was clear: 4-H matters.

You might be wondering—what's the big deal about a proclamation? While it's not a law, it's a powerful symbol. Here's why:

- It raises awareness. When the government publicly supports a cause, more people pay attention.
- It celebrates achievements. Proclamations honor the hard work of 4-H members, volunteers, and leaders.
- It attracts media attention. That means more people hear about 4-H and what it stands for.
- It shows official support. When your county backs your program, it adds credibility and opens doors.
- It inspires action. Recognition can motivate others to join, volunteer, or start new clubs.

This proclamation is more than just a piece of paper - it's a reminder that **citizenship starts with YOU**. Whether you're testifying at a county meeting, organizing a community clean-up, or helping a neighbor, you're living out one of the core 4-H values.

So, what can you do next?

- **Get involved.** Join a 4-H club or start one at your school.
- Speak up. Share your story with local leaders. Attend Engage Locally! on November 6th! Click here for details.
- Take action. Find a cause you care about and rally your friends.

PROCLAMATION

National 4-H Week

October 5 - October 11, 2025

WHEREAS, the National 4-H Week theme, "Beyond Ready," reflects our commitment to preparing the next generation for a rapidly changing world by helping youth develop into resilient, adaptable, and lifelong learners who are prepared for any challenge; and

WHEREAS, for over 120 years, 4-H has served America's youth with the mission to "make the best better," and is now the Nation's largest youth development organization; and

WHEREAS, 4-H programs are delivered by Cooperative Extension, a network of over 100 public universities across the Nation, offering hands-on learning experiences that empower young people to learn by doing; and

WHEREAS, 4-H connects youth and adults to their communities, preparing them for work and life through experiential, inquiry-based learning, while fostering positive youth development through emerging research; and

WHEREAS, the four H's—Head, Heart, Hands, and Health—represent the core values of 4-H and guide youth in becoming engaged citizens and lifelong learners; and

WHEREAS, 4-H prepares youth for careers in STEM, agriculture, public service, and entrepreneurship, contributing to a skilled and future-ready workforce; and

WHEREAS, 4-H youth consistently report increased confidence, leadership skills, and a sense of belonging through their participation in clubs, camps, and service projects; and

WHEREAS, in Fiscal Year (FY) 2025, Prince William 4-H served 636 youth through clubs and camping programs, and engaged 16,790 youth in special interest programs, helping them become confident, independent, resilient, and compassionate leaders; and

WHEREAS, Prince William 4-H youth contributed 13,664 volunteer hours, supported by 624 adult volunteers, and participated in 676 competitive events and programs at the county, district, state, and regional levels; and

WHEREAS, Prince William 4-H volunteers provided an estimated 7.01 full-time equivalent (FTE) value in service to the community, and 4-H hosted 142 events with nearly 1,500 attendees, demonstrating the program's reach and impact;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Prince William Board of County Supervisors hereby proclaims October 5–11, 2025, as National 4-H Week in Prince William County, and urges the community to learn more about 4-H. We join in celebrating and recognizing the unique partnership between our County, Virginia Cooperative Extension, and our State University System, as 4-H equips youth with future-ready skills while meeting them where they are today, through their commitment to the 4-H pledge of "Head, Heart, Hands, and Health," and living by the motto, "Make the Best Better."



Who Should Appy: ALL Prince William 4-H'ers ages 15-18 with exceptional participation in 4-H

The State 4-H Office is once again pleased to announce this exciting award opportunity for 4-H'ers across Virginia. To provide a similar system to the National 4-H Youth in Action Awards, and to encourage high quality applications for the national awards, the State 4-H Office established the Virginia 4-H Youth in Action Awards Program in 2019. The nomination process is now open for our Class of 2026 Youth in Action winners.

This year's process is similar to last year in that the youth themselves may apply directly for the award. However, they are still required to obtain a letter of reference from their Extension Agent (or the VCE professional responsible for 4-H in their Unit). We hope that this will increase participation in the program, while still ensuring that youth interact with their Extension Office.


Youth may recommend themselves for consideration in one or more of the pillar areas of Agriculture, Civic Engagement, Healthy Living, and STEM. One pillar winner will be chosen from each area. In keeping with the national award system, there will no long be an overall winner chosen from the pillar winners. Any 4-H member in Virginia ages 15-18 is eligible to be nominated. Previous winners are not eligible, but a nominee that was

not selected in a previous year may apply again (and they are encouraged to do so).

Each of the four winners will receive:

- A \$500 mini-grant to their Unit to develop a significant community project.
- Recognition at An Evening with Virginia 4-H on January 21, 2026
- A full scholarship to attend Virginia 4-H State Congress June 16-19, 2026, in Blacksburg, VA.
- An opportunity to be featured as the Virginia 4-H Youth Spokesperson for their pillar area.
- An opportunity to represent Virginia 4-H at one or more national events for their pillar area.
- Support and mentorship to apply for the 2027 National 4-H Youth in Action Awards.

H to grow in their leadership skills, assist with state level events, and publicly represent the Virginia 4-H Horse Program at industry level events.
