Trigger Time 4-H Club

October 20, 2025. In the Scopos National Air Rifle League, teams from all over the country are randomly matched up each week with another team to compete in a virtual match. Scores are posted on the Rezults website by the end of the week. Earlier this month, Trigger Time faced Northridge MCJROTC from Greeley, CO. After the scores were uploaded, Trigger Time prevailed with a team score of 1099.9, 37 points over Northridge's 1062.8 and advancing their record to 1-0. Contributing to Trigger Time's team aggregate were Rebecca Ahrens (294.7), Lexi Strand (291.7), Tanner Ridings (278.4), and Koa Mintz (235.1). The rest of the Trigger Time members that participated were Charley Murphy, who was only 0.8 points behind Koa, Steven Ahrens, Aisling Mintz, Adam Grant, and Alexander Wolpert. In the standing position, Lexi scored 98.1, the highest standing score in the match.



In the second match in the national league, Trigger Time competed against Lumen Christi High School out of Anchorage, AK. Representing the team were Lexi Strand (293.3), Rebecca Ahrens (292.8), Tanner Ridings (285.9), and Steven Ahrens (230.8), totaling a score of 1102.8. This was a season record for the team and earned their second win in the league. In addition, Lexi Strand and Tanner Ridings also scored personal records.

Facing Palm Bay MCJROTC from Melbourne, FL, Trigger Time once again posted a season-high, with 1109.8. The contributing team members were Lexi Strand (289.6), Rebecca Ahrens (287.3), Tanner Ridings (280.9), and Ayden Strand (252.0). Unfortunately, Trigger Time still lost to Palm Bay 1109.8 to 1154.9. The team's record now stands at 2-1.

This coming week, Trigger Time is competing against their local rival, Lafayette Gunclub out of Yorktown, VA. At their practice this Monday, the team welcomed Peter Newsham, Prince William County Chief of Police. It was an honor to have him visit and express interest in the club's activities.







Plus, if you're the 4-H Club Reporter, you're building real-world skills like writing, time management, and leadership!

HOW TO DO IT:

On the 1st of each month, write up a short recap (even just a few sentences is fine!). Include:

- Up to 6 photos with captions
- Then sign your name, officer role (like "Club Reporter"), and your club name.



The Virginia 4-H Horse Ambassador Program application for the 2025-2026 cohort is now open. The Horse Ambassador Program utilizes senior youth who are enrolled members of 4-H

to grow in their leadership skills, assist with state level events, and publicly represent the Virginia 4-H Horse Program at industry level events. This year, ambassadors attended 4-H Day at the Capitol, where they saw legislation in action and were able to visit with the VA 4-H Youth Livestock Ambassadors. They also had a visit to the Meadow Event Park for a tour of Secretariat's birthplace. Ambassadors assisted at the Block and Bridle Horse Weekend, Equismartz, State 4-H Congress, and the Rockingham Coop Equine Expo. Furthermore, youth in this program must secure volunteer hours within their unit or district in providing assistance at local events, helping to create or produce programs with their 4-H agent, or more.

The State 4-H Office is once again pleased to announce this exciting award opportunity for 4-H'ers across Virginia. To provide a similar system to the National 4-H Youth in Action Awards, and to encourage high quality applications for the national awards, the State 4-H Office established the Virginia 4-H Youth in Action Awards Program in 2019. The nomination process is now open for our Class of 2026 Youth in Action winners.

This year's process is similar to last year in that the youth themselves may apply directly for the award. However, they are still required to obtain a letter of reference from their Extension Agent (or the VCE professional responsible for 4-H in their Unit). We hope that this will increase participation in the program, while still ensuring that youth interact with their Extension Office.


Youth may recommend themselves for consideration in one or more of the pillar areas of Agriculture, Civic Engagement, Healthy Living, and STEM. One pillar winner will be chosen from each area. In keeping with the national award system, there will no long be an overall winner chosen from the pillar winners. Any 4-H member in Virginia ages 15-18 is eligible to be nominated. Previous winners are not eligible, but a nominee that was

not selected in a previous year may apply again (and they are encouraged to do so).

Each of the four winners will receive:

- A \$500 mini-grant to their Unit to develop a significant community project.
- Recognition at An Evening with Virginia 4-H on January 21, 2026
- A full scholarship to attend Virginia 4-H State Congress June 16-19, 2026, in Blacksburg, VA.
- An opportunity to be featured as the Virginia 4-H Youth Spokesperson for their pillar area.
- An opportunity to represent Virginia 4-H at one or more national events for their pillar area.
- Support and mentorship to apply for the 2027 National 4-H Youth in Action Awards.


