Agg. Malicious Wounding | Strong-Arm Robbery | Assault by Mob *ADDITIONAL ARRESTS - On November 5, detectives charged the two remaining juveniles, identified as a **15-year-old male juvenile** and a **14-year-old male juvenile**, in connection to the robbery that was reported to have occurred at Benton Middle School located at 7411 Hoadly Rd in Manassas (20112) on October 31. A third juvenile was previously arrested the night of the incident in connection with this investigation.

Arrested on November 5: [Juveniles]

A **15-year-old male juvenile** and a **14-year-old male juvenile**, both of Manassas

Both were charged with **aggravated malicious wounding, robbery**, and **assault by mob**

Agg. Malicious Wounding | Strong-Arm Robbery | Assault by Mob [Previously Released] - On October 30 at 7:24PM, officers responded to Benton Middle School located at 7411 Hoadly Rd in Manassas (20112) to investigate a robbery. The investigation revealed the victim, a 13-year-old male juvenile, was approached by three other juveniles following a football game being held at the school. After an initial consensual encounter, the victim was then struck from behind as he walked away and knocked to the ground where his shoes were then taken. An off-duty Virginia State trooper observed the altercation and intervened, detaining one of the suspects. A police K-9 searched the area for the two other suspects who were not located. The suspects were described as teenagers wearing ski-style masks. The victim was taken to an area hospital for treatment of serious injuries. Following the investigation, the apprehended suspect, identified as a **14-year-old male juvenile**, was arrested. **Detectives are asking anyone who may have seen anything that could assist in this investigation or has video around the time of the game to contact police.**

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Incidents

Armed Robbery – On November 6 at 11:10AM, officers responded to the Macy's at Manassas Mall located at 8270 Sudley Rd in Manassas (20109) to investigate a shoplifting. The investigation revealed loss prevention staff had attempted to stop an unknown man in the parking lot for shoplifting. During the encounter, the man displayed a knife before leaving the area on foot. No injuries were reported. Officers checked the area for the suspect who was not located.

Suspect Description:

Black male, late 40s-50s, 5'5" with a medium build and a beard

Last seen wearing a tan shirt, white & dark-colored vest, brown shoes, black pants, and carrying a black Nike backpack with a white Nike symbol

Commercial Burglary – On November 7 at 5:38AM, officers responded to the Tobacco King located at 13273 Worth Ave in Woodbridge (22192) to investigate a burglary. The investigation revealed a front glass window had been broken out before three masked male suspects entered the business and selected several pieces of merchandise and money. The suspects were last seen getting into a vehicle and leaving the area. The suspects are believed to be in the late teens to early 20s with medium builds.

Arrests

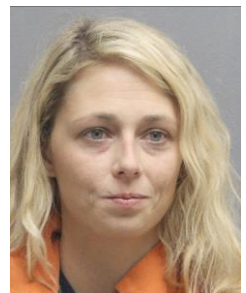

While in custody, the accused began to resist and, at one point, kicked an officer. No injuries were reported. Following the investigation, the accused, identified as Kimberly Lynn **MANNING**, was arrested.
