Nokesville Equestrian 4-H Club: Balancing Hooves and Hustle

MY YEAR WITH THE NOKESVILLE 4-H EQUESTRIAN CLUB

Balancing high school athletics with my passion for horses has made this year both busy and rewarding. In addition to playing flag football and running indoor and outdoor track for my school, I've dedicated much of my time to the Nokesville 4-H Equestrian Club. Officer elections are held in October, but with my packed schedule I decided to hold off on running for a position. Even so, being part of the club has given me countless opportunities to learn, compete, and grow.

COMMUNITY SERVICE AND CLUB ACTIVITIES

The club is involved in community service, participating in programs like "Santa Cops", adopting families at Christmas, and making Valentine's cards with residents at a retirement home. Unfortunately, my schedule kept me from joining these projects this year, but I was able to volunteer at the Food Challenge. One of my favorite traditions remains Christmas caroling on horseback, a unique way to spread holiday cheer while sharing our love of horses with the community.

COMPETITIONS AND ACHIEVEMENTS

This year I competed in both hippology and horse judging at Block and Bridle and EquiSmartz. Winning a belt buckle at Block and Bridle was a highlight, and finishing second at EquiSmartz qualified me for the Virginia State 4-H Horse Judging Team.

As part of the State team, I traveled to Georgia, Ohio, and Kentucky. At the Southern Regional in Perry, GA, I placed 7th overall individually, with Virginia Team "A" finishing 4th overall. At the All American Quarter Horse Congress in Ohio, I competed against 136 participants, placing 41st overall, while our team finished 19th. The season concluded at the Eastern National Round Up in Louisville, KY, where I placed 7th overall individually, and Virginia earned Reserve Champion.

SHOWING FIRE AND MAJOR

Beyond judging, I also competed at Southern Regionals with my pony, Dare U (better known as Fire). Together we earned Reserve Champion in Showmanship and placed 10th in both Hunter Type Geldings and Equitation Over Fences.

Southern Regionals is always a favorite, but this year I was most excited for the Virginia 4-H Horse and Pony Championships in September. Normally, I only show Fire in Hunter Pleasure Pony and Large Pony Hunter, but this year I also showed Tinariwen (aka Major) in Dressage. It was a phenomenal experience, as I won the High Point Dressage score, the Dressage Classics, Hunter Pleasure Pony Classics, and earned Reserve Champion titles in Hunter Pleasure Pony, Large Pony Hunter, and Senior Showmanship.

LOOKING BACK

Reflecting on this past year, I am proud of the balance I've managed between school academics, school sports, travel sports and 4-H. While I couldn't participate in every service project, I contributed where I could and celebrated many successes in the show ring and judging arena. More importantly, I've grown as a member of the community, a rider, competitor, and teammate.

Being part of the Nokesville 4-H Equestrian Club has taught me resilience, discipline, and the value of community. From caroling on horseback to representing Virginia at national competitions, each experience has strengthened my love for horses and my pride in being part of 4-H. I look forward to continuing to build on these accomplishments, supporting my club, and embracing new challenges in the year ahead.












Prince William 4-H LUB REPORT

- Build Your Communication Skills: Join our SPIN Club: Leading by Speaking! It's a 6meeting series starting December 10. Registration is free, but required. (See Page 8 for details.)





Each year, the Prince William Chamber Foundation, in partnership with the Prince William Chamber of Commerce, awards \$2,500 scholarships to


