## Resident's Guide to Solid Waste Management Services

**Solid Waste Fee** was adopted September 1, 1998, by the Board of County Supervisors and updated April 2023 to fund landfill operations, future cell construction and related services. The landfill will serve the County's solid waste disposal needs until approximately 2060.

The **solid waste fee** appears as a separate line item on the real estate property tax bill, due in July and December each year.

### Annual fee:

- Single-family detached home - \$75
- Townhouse - \$67.50
- Mobile home - \$60
- Condo - \$50.19

This fee covers some of the cost of programs including the convenience center areas, recycling, household hazardous waste disposal, electronics recycling, yard waste and composting. It also provides collection sites for residents in rural areas to dispose of their waste and helps fund new landfill cell construction.

All residents, businesses, non-profit organizations, and government agencies are required to pay the solid waste fee. Residents may transport their *regular* trash to the facilities at no charge. Some special wastes (e.g. tires, manure, pallets, construction debris, etc.) may require an extra fee. Call 703-792-5750 about specific wastes.

### Cover Your Load Please...

Debris blown from vehicles is a major source of road-side litter. Please be sure to cover or secure refuse before traveling. This is a requirement per the Prince William County Code (Section 22-145). People who fail to cover their loads are subject to fines (a Class 3 misdemeanor).

**It's the Law!**

**Trash, Recycling, Yard Waste Collection** in Prince William County is provided by [private refuse haulers](#). Incorporated towns and many homeowner associations (HOA) arrange for residential trash and recycling services. Please check with your town or HOA before personally arranging for services. To locate a service provider, view a full list of all County-permitted haulers on the Solid Waste website.

### Recycling is mandatory

for residents and businesses. Refuse haulers are required to provide residents with at least weekly **recycling collection** (mixed paper and food and beverage containers). Most haulers provide trash carts and recycling bins and/or carts.

### Yard Waste separation is mandatory

March through December in Prince William County. This includes leaves, grass, brush, logs (up to 24 inches in diameter and no more than four feet long), plant waste, mulch, and brush. Also, Christmas trees will be collected the first two weeks in January. Residents may bring yard waste material to the Landfill or Compost facility loose in a container, or in paper bags. No plastic bags.



This **policy** allows the County to divert grass, leaves, brush and branches from the County landfill, saving landfill space for other materials.

### Weekly Collection Sites

are located at **The Nokesville School** and **Evergreen Fire Station** on Saturday mornings. For convenience, PWC residents from rural areas can bring their bagged household waste and recycling to one of these sites. These collection sites may not be available during community events. Bulky items like furniture, construction and demolition debris, dirt, concrete, yard waste, etc., are not accepted and should be taken to the Landfill or Compost facility (Mon.-Fri. only). ### Recycling Trailers

are located throughout the County for residents to recycle bottles, cans, cardboard and mixed paper. Purple bins for glass bottles, jugs and jars are also available at some locations. For trailer [locations](#) visit [www.pwcva.gov/trashandrecycling](http://www.pwcva.gov/trashandrecycling).







**Prince William County Landfill Convenience Center**  
Prince William County (PWC) residents can bring most waste generated in PWC to the landfill at no charge. Waste from other areas will not be accepted and there are penalties for attempting to dispose of waste generated outside the County. The landfill offers a full-service trash disposal area, recycling collection and yard waste disposal.

**Compost Facility Convenience Center** offers many of the same services as the Landfill for residents’ recycling and disposal needs. Trash disposal, recycling collection and yard waste disposal are available. However,



construction/demolition debris and bulky items (furniture, mattresses, large items) are limited to Monday-Friday disposal at the Compost Facility and some materials are accepted in limited amounts. No commercial disposal, except yard waste, is accepted at the facility. Household Hazardous Waste and Electronics Recycling is not available.

**Construction/Demolition Debris Landfill and \*Compost Facility**  
Residents may dispose of small amounts of construction and demolition debris (up to a pick-up truck load/2.5 cubic yards) from home improvement projects. \*Construction debris disposal at the Compost facility is limited to Monday-Friday.

**Contractors may only bring construction and demolition debris to the Landfill.** Limit: pick-up truck load/2.5 cubic yards, fee \$25, paid by credit/debit card. Call 703-792-5750 to inquire about where to dispose of large amounts of construction and demolition debris.

**Tires Landfill and Compost Facility**  
Residents may dispose of up to four (4) **passenger car and truck tires** per month at no charge. Tires are not accepted from businesses.

**Battery and Auto Fluid Collection Area Landfill and Compost Facility**  
Used motor oil, antifreeze, oil filters, and automotive batteries (hybrid car batteries are not accepted) may be disposed of at the Landfill and the Compost facility during regular business hours. **Limits:** Landfill 15-gal./visit; Compost facility 5-gal./visit.

Household batteries should not be placed in the regular trash. All household batteries may be recycled at the Landfill and Compost facility locations, during regular business hours. Place tape over terminals or place each battery in its own plastic bag. Loose batteries may leak or catch fire during transportation. Rechargeable batteries may also be recycled at most Best Buy, Staples, Mom’s Organic Market, Home Depot, Lowes and uBreakiFix stores.



**Household Hazardous Waste & Electronics Recycling Program**  
**Landfill: Wednesdays & Saturdays 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.**  
Residents are encouraged to bring potentially **hazardous material** from their homes for proper disposal. **Items accepted:** pesticides, fertilizers, cleaning substances, paints, stains, thinners, lacquers, varnishes, caulks, adhesives, pool treatment chemicals, propane tanks (20 pounds or less), gasoline, waxes, yard care products, driveway sealers, chemicals, cooking oil, ant bait/traps, pet supplies, and fluorescent light bulbs. Items should be in original containers. **Limits:** 40 pounds solid or 15 gallons liquid. Personal **electronics** and computers (up to three units) are also accepted.

Residents of Prince William County and the towns of Occoquan, Quantico, Dumfries, and Haymarket may use these services at no extra charge.

Electronics and household hazardous waste are not accepted from businesses or residents of the cities of Manassas or Manassas Park.

**Clothing, Shoes & Household Items Reuse/Donation Program**  
Donations bins provided by Helpsy® are located in the Convenience Center area at both facilities. Residents may put a variety of [items in the bin](#) for reuse and recycling.

**Compost and Mulch Sale**

***Film Recycling Tip:** Plastic shopping bags, plastic wrappers, dry cleaning bags, and other plastic film can be recycled at most grocery stores and large retailers. Plastic bags, etc. are not accepted for recycling at Solid Waste facilities and they should not be placed in regular recycling bins. **Glass Recycling** bins are available throughout Northern Virginia for glass bottles, jugs and jars only. Five “Purple Bin” [locations](#) in Prince William and numerous other locations in region. Visit the Solid Waste [website](#) for more information on this program.

**Medication Drop Boxes** for residents to dispose of unwanted or unused pills, patches, ointment, or other medications are available at three permanent drop boxes at designated Prince William County Police Stations, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Liquids, needles, vape devices, or vape cartridges cannot be disposed of in the drop boxes.
