PRINCE WILLIAM 4-H TAKES ON RICHMOND: HIGHLIGHTS FROM VIRGINIA 4-H DAY AT THE CAPITOL

Last week, Prince William 4-H'ers hit the road to Richmond for Virginia 4-H Day at the Capitol - and it was an unforgettable adventure in leadership, citizenship, and hands-on learning about how our state government works. Here are some highlights from our day:

Meeting the Leaders Who Shape Virginia

Our delegation didn't just tour the Capitol - they talked with the people who help make laws for our state! Throughout the day, we met with: Sen. McPike, Sen. Carroll-Foy, Del. Maldonado, Del. Sewell, Del. Thomas, Del. Torian, and Del. Henson. 4-H'ers shared stories about their projects, service, and leadership experiences - and asked great questions about what it's like to represent the community in Richmond.

A View from the Top: Before diving deeper into the legislative world, we stopped by the Observation Deck at Richmond City Hall. From 18 floors up, we had a stunning 360° view of the city - definitely a photo-op moment!

Rally at the Bell Tower: Next, we joined the Virginia 4-H Rally at the Bell Tower in Capitol Square with several Virginia Secretaries. Hundreds of 4-H'ers from across the state filled the lawn with green as we celebrated citizenship, leadership, and the power of youth voices.

Inside the Capitol: We toured the historic Capitol building and even stepped into the Senate Chamber, getting a behind-the-scenes look at where big decisions happen. Seeing the legislative process up close made what we learn in civics feel real.

Sharing Clover & Peanuts: In true 4-H spirit, our members helped deliver 139 clover plants - one for every member of the House of Delegates and Senate - as a symbol of growth, community, and appreciation. We also delivered packages of Virginia peanuts to highlight the importance of agriculture in our state and connect to Senate Bill 300, which promotes Virginia's agricultural industry (including naming peanuts as the official state snack!).

A Big 4-H Thank-You: Huge shoutout to Virginia 4-H for organizing such an inspiring day of citizenship in action! And thank you to the many senators, delegates, and staffers who took time to meet with us and give us a glimpse into how state laws are made.

Why 4-H Day at the Capitol Matters: This annual event gives youth the chance to learn how government works, meet legislators face-to-face, share their 4-H stories, explore roles like congressional aides and pages, and tour the Capitol and historic sites around Richmond. It's a chance to see firsthand how your voice can make an impact! We hope you'll join our delegation next January!

Thanks to Prince William Master Gardeners, we've got FREE Virginia native seeds and potting soil for PW 4-H'ers who want to try (or level up) their skills in milk jug gardening. It's your turn to rock this project as part of the 4-H Agriculture Pillar!

Here's how to start:

- Step 1: Grab a clean milk jug
- Step 2: Cut it in half & punch/drill drainage holes in the bottom
- Step 3: Fill with moist potting soil & plant your seeds
- Step 4: Tape it shut, label it, and place in a sunny spot

When the weather warms up, remove the lid and transplant your plants into your home garden—or **team up with your 4-H Club to grow flowers for the Prince William Fairgrounds!**

INBOUND EXCHANGE DATES: July 22 - August 15

Virginia 4-H partners with States' 4-H to offer an inbound exchange experience. This summer our goal is to host 20 young people and 2 adult chaperones from Japan.

- * To host youth, you must have a child within 4 years of age of the Japanese delegate.
- * To host an adult chaperone, you do not need to have children in your home.

PROGRAM NOTES

- No previous 4-H experience is required. Host Families will receive support from the state coordinator before, during, and after the exchange. There is no financial stipend.
- Host family must be available to pick up and drop off delegate in Richmond.
- Delegate Host Families must have youth host sibling to match to a same gender Japanese delegate. Host siblings should be 10+ years old. Japanese delegates are ages ~13-16
- Chaperone Host Families do not have to have a youth in the family
- All applying Host Families will be screened and interviewed as part of our risk management protocol. Agents will conduct the home visits that are part of the screening with guidance from Inbound Coordinator (Wendy). Only after passing all screenings, do families enroll in 4-H Online.
- Families hosting youth delegates must provide adult supervision during the time of the exchange/ homestay. Adults cannot both work outside the home all day without another adult present.
- Japanese delegates have a range of English language abilities.
