4-H'ers Explored the Impacts of Body Language



At last week's PW 4-H Leading by Speaking SPIN Project meeting, 4-H'ers explored how effective speakers use gestures and body language to strengthen their messages. Under the guidance of Dr. D, members learned that gestures aren't just hand movements - they are powerful visual tools that help an audience understand, connect with, and remember what a speaker is saying.

Participants discovered several types of purposeful gestures, including:

- Descriptive gestures that show size, shape, direction, or location, such as dramatically pointing to emphasize "He went that way!"
- Gestures that show importance or urgency, such as striking a fist into an open palm to highlight a key point.
- Comparison or contrast gestures, using both hands either moving together or in opposition to illustrate similarities and differences.

4-H'ers also discussed how gestures should be large enough to be seen, yet not so exaggerated that they distract from the message. They practiced developing movements that look natural, intentional, and confident - skills that come from rehearsal. Dr. D encouraged members to rehearse their speeches using a mirror, a friend, or even video equipment when available, so they could watch themselves and refine their use of body language. During our practice speeches, youth worked on relaxing their posture, using nervous energy productively, maintaining eye contact, and demonstrating objects or visuals without over-handling them. The session wrapped up with discussion, feedback, and leadership practice through agenda-based meeting activities, including Table Topics, speech evaluation, and chairing segments of the meeting.

Overall, 4-H'ers walked away with stronger presentation skills and a new appreciation for how gestures can help them show what they mean - not just say it. We're looking forward to watching them SHINE with their new skills at PW 4-H Contest Day!



The Wildlife Challenge combines wildlife identification and general knowledge. Participants visit stations where they may be presented with a wildlife specimen and questions related to the species. Participants may be asked to identify an animal by specimen or portion of specimen, photo, animal sign, or sound. Questions for the Wildlife Challenge may be from information within Concepts and Terms, Ecoregions, Wildlife Species, Wildlife Management Practices, and the Glossary. Wildlife food items and questions pertaining to wildlife foods also may be included. Appendix B provides definitions of various wildlife foods. Refer to species descriptions to learn what various species eat.

SENIOR DIVISION: Full competition for youth ages 14-19 (must be 14 and not 19 as of January 1, 2026). Youth must have a team of 3 or 4 members to be eligible to compete in the full contest and qualify for the national competition. Individual seniors may compete; however, they will only be eligible for the individual awards. This division will include: Wildlife Challenge, Written Management Plan, and Oral Defense of Written Plan.





Virginia 4-H partners with States' 4-H to offer an inbound exchange experience. This summer our goal is to host 20 young people and 2 adult chaperones from Japan.

- * To host youth, you must have a child within 4 years of age of the Japanese delegate.
- * To host an adult chaperone, you do not need to have children in your home.

PROGRAM NOTES

- No previous 4-H experience is required. Host Families will receive support from the state coordinator before, during, and after the exchange. There is no financial stipend.
- Host family must be available to pick up and drop off delegate in Richmond.
- Delegate Host Families must have youth host sibling to match to a same gender Japanese delegate. Host siblings should be 10+ years old. Japanese delegates are ages ~13-16
- Chaperone Host Families do not have to have a youth in the family
- All applying Host Families will be screened and interviewed as part of our risk management protocol. Agents will conduct the home visits that are part of the screening with guidance from Inbound Coordinator (Wendy). Only after passing all screenings, do families enroll in 4-H Online.
- Families hosting youth delegates must provide adult supervision during the time of the exchange/homestay. Adults cannot both work outside the home all day without another adult present.
- Japanese delegates have a range of English language abilities.
- Delegates are here to experience every day American life. No special activities need to be planned.
