





COMMUNITY IDEAS



- 1 minimizing disturbance from nearby brewery is a challenge, but one worth pursuing to preserve sacred /historic feeling necessary of such a space
- 2 entrance portico at John Marshall Hwy to end by Chapman Mill
- 3 i think we should make sure everyone feels welcome and seen/heard
- 4 how to preserve the cemeteries, allow the families' access, but tell the history of this site
- 5 no large events: only small events
- 6 make sure everyone knows the rules of the park
- 7 -entrance, washington family replica home (PSC Deed), family cemetery expansion/protection -parking, all on 2-4 acres
- 8 park serves as an introduction to the history of thoroughfare
- 9 can it be used to be an introduction to tell the story of thoroughfare
- 10 -connect sidewalk from aunt betty house to leopold preserve -place interpretive granite stone blocks etched with stories
- 11 to connect thoroughfare historic park to nearby leopold's preserve: green corridors are important!
- 12 proposed park is not representative of thoroughfare -- must include leopold's
- 13 preserve and transportation to chapman mill -interpretive signs everywhere
- 14 the odd fellows lodge
- 15 open to ideas as to what the community would like to see here that fits the vision
- 16 preserve/protect as much land as possible in this area- don't want to see it become commercial
- 17 include trolley or bus or carts- parking at all areas
- 18 extend boundary west to incorporate civil war activity- add transportation story of 'thoroughfare gap' westward paths, roads, train
