### Incidents

**Brandishing a Firearm | Assault & Battery** – On May 1 at 8:48PM, officers responded to the Festival at Manassas Shopping Center located in 10300 block of Festival Ln in Manassas (20109) to investigate a brandishing. The investigation revealed the victim, a 41-year-old man, was standing outside his vehicle in the parking lot of the shopping center when a white, older model sedan, possibly a Ford Focus, with tinted windows drove towards him. The driver of the vehicle reportedly pointed a firearm towards the sky while the front passenger struck the victim several times with water beads fired from a gel blaster. The suspects eventually drove off. The victim sustained minor injuries. No other contact or injuries were reported.

**Reckless Handling of a Firearm** – On May 6 at 12:11AM, officers responded to a residence located in the 14000 block of Willet Way in Gainesville (20155) to investigate a destruction of property. The investigation revealed the occupants of the home heard the sound of gunfire before locating a bullet hole in the drywall of an interior wall. No injuries or other property damage were reported.

### Arrests

**Commercial Burglary** – On May 6, officers concluded an investigation into a commercial burglary that was reported to have occurred at the Tabacco Hut located at 12518 Gordon Blvd in Woodbridge (22192) on April 22. The investigation revealed at approximately 11:32PM on April 22, officers responded to the business for an alarm activation. A suspect, later identified as a juvenile, used a rock to break a window before making entry into the business. Officers located the accused inside the location in possession of unpaid merchandise. The accused was detained without incident and later released to a guardian. On May 6, officers obtained a juvenile petition for the accused, identified as a **15-year-old male juvenile**.
