Commercial Burglary *ARREST- On July 22, the suspect sought in connection with the burglary that was reported to have occurred at Mi Tierra Deli Restaurant, located at 14120 Jefferson Davis Hwy in Woodbridge (22191) on July 11, was arrested. Following the investigation, the accused, identified as Charles Allen **ARRINGTON** Jr, was taken into custody by detectives without incident.

Commercial Burglary [Previously Released]- On July 11 at 5:38AM, officers responded to Mi Tierra Deli Restaurant, located at 14120 Jefferson Davis Hwy in Woodbridge (22191) to investigate an alarm activation. The investigation revealed an unknown man shattered the front entryway glass window and entered the business. The suspect removed an undisclosed amount of money from a tip jar, before leaving the area on foot. A police K-9 searched the area for the suspect who were not located. The suspect was described as a black male, age 35-45 years, wearing a green t-shirt, green camouflage-patterned cargo shorts, black shoes and a black hat.

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Incidents

Reckless Handling of a Firearm- On July 23 at 2:55AM, officers responded to the 10300 block of Copeland Dr in Manassas (20109) to investigate a report of shots fired. The investigation revealed multiple gunshots were heard in the area and two unoccupied vehicles and a residence were struck by gunfire. Officers located multiple shell casings in the roadway. No injuries and no additional property damage were reported. No suspect description was available.

Reckless Handling of a Firearm- On July 22, officers responded to the 10400 block of Butterfield St in Manassas (20109) to investigate a report of shots fired. The investigation revealed at approximately 1:50AM that morning, multiple gunshots were heard in the area, and an unoccupied vehicle was later found to be struck by gunfire. No shell casing were located and no injuries or additional property damage were reported.

Attempted Residential Burglary- On July 22, officers responded to a residence located in the 17200 block of Wexford Lp in Dumfries (22026) to investigate a reported attempted burglary. The investigation revealed between 3:00PM and 9:45PM that day, the lock to the front door had been tampered with and damaged. No entry was made into the home, and no property was reported missing.
