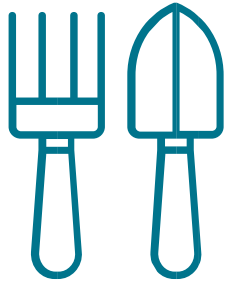

Nutrition Education

The Virginia Cooperative Extension's Family Nutrition Program provides education in the areas of basic nutrition, physical activity, safe food handling, and thrifty food shopping. Programming is provided for groups of adults and groups of youth who enroll in a lesson series of six to eight classes per series. Comprehensive education classes are offered in-person at human services offices, homeless shelters, retail stores, free clinics, pregnancy centers, farmers markets, health centers, food pantries, schools, churches, after-school programs, low-income housing communities, Head Start, schools and parent meetings. Programs are offered to SNAP- eligible residents of Prince William County and the cities of Manassas and Manassas Park. The program is federally funded by the Expanded Food and Nutrition Education Program (EFNEP) grant.

4-H Youth Development



4-H programs provide experiential learning opportunities for youth through project and community clubs, in-school and afterschool programs, and 4-H camps. Caring and trained adults follow a planned program and offer multiple learning opportunities for youth in areas of their choosing. 4-H after-school and in-school programs incorporate hands-on activities with 4 H curriculum. 4-H overnight and day camps offer recreational and educational opportunities in a camp setting. 4-H curriculum is research based and promotes positive youth development through experiential learning.
