## I. Major Issues

A. The School Budget is handled independently from those budgets reviewed by the County Executive. The School Board, which is elected by the citizens of Prince William County, submits its budget request directly to the Board of County Supervisors (BOCS). The BOCS then reviews the proposed budget through work sessions with the School Board. The Adopted FY 12 Budget for the Prince William County Public Schools includes a general fund transfer of \$425,780,174 and a capital fund (Cable TV) transfer of \$400,000 for a total local transfer of \$426,180,174.

- Nine elementary schools ranked in the Northern Virginia Top 100
- All 10 of our high schools continue to be ranked in the top six percent out of approximately 27,000 high schools nationwide
- All schools are fully accredited
- SAT scores are up 9 points
  - Up 20 points over the past two years
- 31.7% of graduates had a qualifying score in Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, or Cambridge examinations
  - Exceeds national average of 15%

- On-time graduation rate improved to 88%
  - An improvement of 3.76 percentage points
