A Neighborhood Study Circle . . .

- Is a diverse group of about 15 participants who meet for respectful and productive conversations.
- Is led by trained facilitators who keep members safe and the dialogue on track.
- Begins with people getting to know one another, looks at a problem from many points of view, explores solutions, and develops ideas for action and change.
- Helps the neighborhood connect dialogue to action and change.


